MOR features reptiles, trips to space & Montana's past

A reptile's personality may not be the first thing that slithers to mind, but the latest exhibit at Museum of the Rockies is ready to show-case each unique species' habits and behaviors.



Reptiles: The Beautiful and the Deadly is now open. Reptiles have enduring appeal, and this interactive zoological exhibition will bring you eye to eye with living species from around the world. Deadly snakes, colorful lizards, unusual turtles and rugged crocodilians are exhibited in naturalistic habitats. You can "milk" a viper, learn to speak croc in under five minutes, and test your knowledge with "Turtle Trivia" or "Lizard Wizard." An experienced zoo professional remains with the exhibit to care for the living collection.

MOR's **Living History Farm** is now open for the summer season, allowing visitors to experience what life was like in the Treasure State more than 100 years ago. In 1989, the Tinsley House was relocated to Museum, bringing with it the history of Montana's home-steading era. Skilled costumed interpreters will take you back in time as they cook over a wood-burning stove, demonstrate cooking skills and recipes from the 1890s, tend to the Heirloom Garden, and forge iron in the blacksmith's shop. Take time this summer to enjoy the beautiful sights of the garden, the smells of home cooking, and the history of

a time gone by that lives on today. The Living History Farm is included with Museum admission. Closed Monday and Tuesday. Also at MOR, Taylor Planetarium has reopened in a limited capacity. **To Space and Back** and **Dark Understanding Dark Matter** are now showing multiple times daily. Displayed on a 40-foot dome, this state of the art projection system allows visitors to experience our universe and world in vivid colors, dramatic motion and brilliant displays of light.

Taylor Planetarium shows are included with Museum admission. Seating is limited and available on a first-come, first-served basis. *Please note: During Montana's phased reopening, MOR will limit admittance with reservations encouraged. Walk-ins admitted if availability allows. Face-coverings are required for entry into the Museum, Planetarium and Living History Farm.* MOR is now open from 9am-4pm daily. Stock up on local goods at area farmers' markets

After an isolating spring, farmers' market season has returned to Bozeman and the surrounding communities. Here's a look at some of the local markets where you can find garden-fresh produce, awesome food, novelty items, and more physically distanced offerings.

Formerly held at Bogert Pavilion, the rebranded **Bozeman Farmers' Market** continues on Tuesday evenings in Lindley Park. Market hours are from 5–8pm through September 8th. Dedicated to the promotion of local growers, artisans, crafters, nonprofits, small businesses, food artisans and musicians, this local favorite is a fantastic way to support our community. These markets feature fresh produce from local farmers, arts & crafts, dinner options and more. Grab some groceries, get that gift made locally for an upcoming birthday, and kick back with a bite under the summer sky!

Western Sustainability Exchange's **Livingston Farmers Market** is held Wednesday nights in Miles Band Shell Park through September 16th. The event begins at

4:30pm with an At-Risk Patrons shopping hour, and continues until 7:30pm for all market-goers. This destination event features locally grown produce and meats, baked goods, prepared foods, beer, arts and crafts vendors, and much more! It's a great place to stock up on locally grown foods, shop from local artisans, or just relax and enjoy the view of the Yellowstone River and Absaroka Mountains.

Also on Wednesdays, the **Big Sky Farmers Market** takes over Town Center's Fire Pit Park from 5–8pm through August 26th. Every year, numerous vendors including local and regional farmers, professional artisans, young artists and entrepreneurs, and community organizations come together to help foster and maintain a market that's true to Big Sky mountain culture. Beginning July 9th, **Belgrade Community Market** returns to Lewis & Clark Park for its fourth annual summer series. The weekly market will continue on subsequent Thursday evenings from 4–7pm through September 10th. The

region's newest market provides a venue for homemade, handmade, and homegrown vendors to sell their local products. The weekly event provides the community with a fun, family friendly setting to buy produce and local goods from their

neighbors.

The original **Gallatin Valley Farmers' Market** is held Saturday mornings from 9am–noon through September 12th. The market takes place at the Gallatin County Fairgrounds in Bozeman. Serving the community for more than four decades, the Gallatin Valley Farmers' Market provides an opportunity and location for numerous local vendors of homemade food, handmade crafts, and locally grown produce to market, display and sell their goods to promote economic well-being and support the development of home-based businesses.

– July 14th and 16th, 4–5pm: Dr. Marshall E. Bloom of the Rocky Mountain Laboratory will discuss its century-old history, its transition into a National Institute of Allergy and Infectious Diseases under Dr. Anthony Fauci and its vital role in the coronavirus pandemic.

"Montana's Sibanye-Stillwater Mine: An Overview of Best Mining Practices by a Global Palladium and Platinum Producer"

– July 20th and 21st, 9–10am: Paul Holick, senior development geologist at the mine, will outline the mining history of the Stillwater Complex in southcentral Montana, while Randy Weimer – who supervises the environmental group at the mine – will address environmental and economic impacts and modern mining practices.

Norris Hot Springs is back & better rejuvenated than ever

The spring of 2020 will be remembered by **Norris Hot Springs** as a season of rest and recuperation for the Water of the Gods – while countless people lost their health, lives or loved ones. We send them our compassion.

Here deer, ducks, geese, antelope, sandhill cranes and many songbird species, along with creatures too small to see, have been the only benefactors of the mineral-rich, hot artesian flow of 80 gal/min and 120°. Nature has rebounded during this period of relative human inactivity. The Springs' thriving wildlife rely on the constant flow of hot water to sustain their natural, complex ecosystem.

Wetlands created by the springs' drainage hold the eponymous Warm Springs Creek, emptying into the Madison River at its most popular tube and boat ramp.

Thanks to the government's PPP loan program and the help of First Security Bank, Norris received a partially forgivable loan and staffers were furloughed for only three

and clientele from near and far.

Easing back into business with ample safety protocols for a COVID-19 world, Norris is committed to the well-being of staff, customers and the community, while maintaining a commitment to providing the perfect soak, delicious local food, and an authentic Montana experience.

The Norris Pool is now open to the public Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays only, from 10am–10pm.

With a limit of 50 people on a first come, first served basis, protocols are being followed scrupulously as friends from infected places begin to filter back into Montana to camp and visit and recreate. The staff is committed to keeping our state healthy.

Private parties are a very popular new option, available on Wednesdays and Thursdays between the hours of 8am and 10 pm. Parties of up to 10 people can reserve the Norris pool, with food and drink service, for two-

hour sessions through schedulingcity.com or at norrishotsprings.com.

Quality, local, organic food prepared with focus and dedication remains a primary part of Norris Hot Springs' service. The 50-Mile Snack Bar and the No Loose Dogs Saloon are open during all pool hours, including during private reservations. The 50-Mile Grill gets fired up Friday, Saturday and Sunday from 5–10pm, and Abe will be serving up with his usual aplomb, local, organic, grass-fed burgers grilled to perfection and many vegetable options too – Montana style!

The Norris Hot Springs campground is up and running with nine RV sites and four tent camping sites. Sites can be reserved through the website.

Norman is honored to be named the Bozeman Symphony's new Music Director, and sees the appointment as the beginning of an exciting adventure. "I am inspired by Bozeman's support of the arts, and the closeness of the community as a whole. Everyone that I met during my time in Bozeman, from baristas at coffee shops to The Last Wind Up, expressed a genuine interest in the Bozeman Symphony. I look forward to joining this community and creating musical experiences that continue to bring us closer together," said Huynh.

He adds, "As I step into the role of Music Director, I am most excited about the potential of what we can accomplish together. I look forward to expanding our collaborative efforts and building lasting partnerships with other arts institutions in town. Norman's recent conducting engagements include the St. Louis Symphony Orchestra, Detroit Symphony, Rochester Philharmonic, Orchestra Sinfónica del Vallès, Eugene Symphony, Grant Park Music Festival, and the Princess Galyani Vadhana Youth Orchestra of Bangkok. He has served as a cover conductor for the New York Philharmonic and Los Angeles Philharmonic with John Williams.

Norman has been at the forefront of moving orchestral music out of the traditional concert hall into venues where an orchestra is not conventionally found. In 2011, he co-founded the Occasional Symphony in Baltimore to celebrate holidays by performing innovative concerts in distinct venues throughout the inner-city. As the Assistant Conductor of the PSO from 2013-2016, Norman visited over sixty schools across the state of Maine and co-founded Symphony & Spirits, a series of events for young professionals, between the ages of 21-39, to make the orchestra more accessible and engaging for a younger audience.

In an unprecedented time, the unthinkable has redefined every aspect of how people live and look at the world around them. For Kenny Chesney, who spent last year playing to the always passionate members of No Shoes Nation in areas not visited by his massive stadium runs, the idea of not returning to the stadiums on his 2020 schedule was inconceivable. And then COVID-19 created a reality where the number of unknowns saw the songwriter/superstar first postpone the opening leg, then ultimately push the Blue Chair Bay Rum Presents **Kenny Chesney's Chillaxification Tour** Fueled by Marathon into 2021.

FWP discourages littering, dumping at sites; fire safety stressed

From Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks (FWP)
 Many **fishing access and other sites** administered by Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks have seen increased use as people enjoy the outdoors in the midst of COVID-19. FWP encourages people to get outside but urges all recreationists to be good stewards of these sites. They belong to everyone and are maintained through the sale of hunting and fishing licenses.

FWP staff have come across several incidents lately of still-smoldering campfires at fishing access sites and Wildlife Management Areas, and of noncombustible items being dumped into and around firepits.

For example, a window air-conditioning unit was recently discarded on a picnic table in Region 7 at East Rosebud FAS near Forsyth.

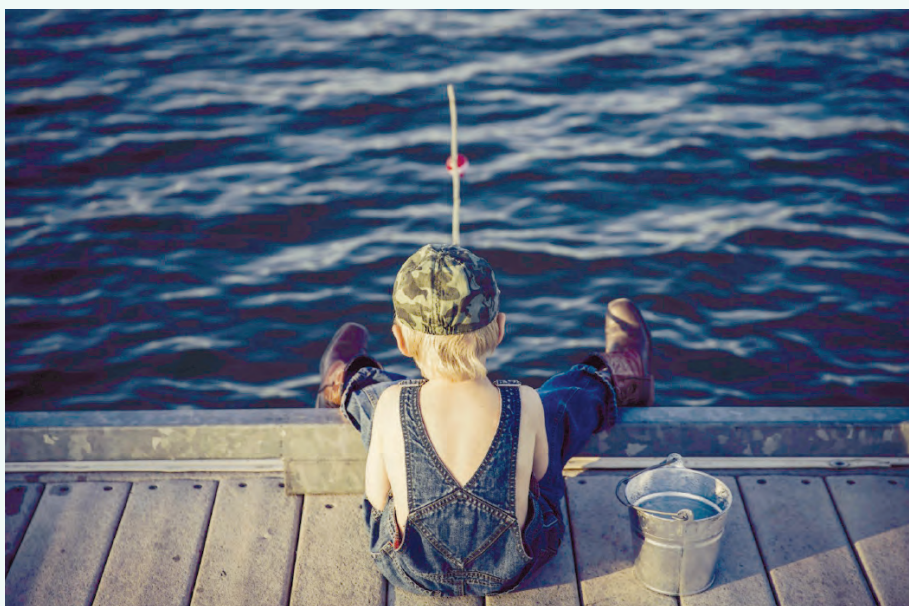
“There’s a lot of dumping things into the firepits and expecting the next person to burn it,” said Forsyth-area Game Warden Wyatt Pickens. “Some are treating them like trash cans.”

People may not see a problem with leaving trash in or near firepits to be burned later, but the trash may blow away, pile up

and create a fire hazard, or attract bears and other wildlife – increasing chances of encounters with humans. Items like glass, plastic and metal also don’t break down after burning, leaving litter and hazards for the next camper.

Littering while hunting, fishing or using public lands is punishable by a fine and a one-year suspension of hunting, fishing or trapping privileges, Pickens noted.

Recreationists are asked to be conscious of fire danger and thoroughly extinguish any campfires with water or dirt before leaving the area. It takes only a light breeze for coals to reignite and



ing of items at FWP sites is illegal.

The extra time spent cleaning up littered sites takes away from staff time to maintain them for everyone’s enjoyment. FWP invites you to enjoy the outdoors this summer, but please help keep these public resources in top shape!

Don’t throw away, recycle for another day!

Though 2020 has been nothing short of exhausting, we’re still facing the always-looming threat of climate change. **Recycling** is a simple but effective way to do our part in its slowing.

The Gallatin Valley is home to numerous drop-off sites and also features a number of curbside recycling services. A lack of options there aren’t! And though plenty of Bozemanites already find themselves on the green bandwagon, everyone can use a refresher from time to time.

A few tips:

- Recycling should not be bagged
- All materials should be empty, clean and dry
- Leave labels attached with caps on
- Plastics #3 to #7 and unlabeled plastics are **NOT RECYCLABLE**
- Plastics #1 and #2 that are not bottle shaped are **NO LONGER RECYCLABLE** (clam shells, cups, etc.)
- Do not include garbage, food waste or unclean items – contaminates can lead to an entire load of otherwise clean recyclables ending up as garbage

Acceptable Items:

- Bottle and jug-shaped Plastics #1 & #2

- Crushed aluminum, tin and steel Cans
- Flattened Cardboard (no wax-coated items)
- Paper items including newspaper, magazines and office papers
- Phone Books and Paper Bags

Unacceptable Items:

- Plastics #3 to #7
- Non-bottle-shaped #1 and #2 Plastics
- Glass items of any kind and ceramics
- Food-contaminated boxes and other paper items
- Paper milk cartons and juice containers
- Styrofoam containers and packing peanuts
- Aerosol cans, pill bottles, plastic bags, foil and metal items
- Toxic product containers, batteries, light bulbs and electronic waste

was he guilty?

Her curiosity into the possible innocence of Seth Danner has haunted her since visiting the museum as a child. Her book became a labor of love as well as a personal study into the simplicity and complications of human behavior, revealing “a light of illumination” on the characteristics of the man who was judged and those who condemned him.
