

### Historian Robert Rydell presents on significance of world's fairs

The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI) at Montana State University, formerly MSU Wonderlust, will host its annual winter/spring semester reception from 4pm to 6pm on Wednesday, January 6th, via Webex featuring keynote speaker Robert W. Rydell, a professor of history and director of the American studies program at MSU.

Rydell's keynote, "I Have Seen the Future: Reflections on World's Fairs and their Imprint on the Modern World," will be followed by brief presentations, a O&A session with winter/spring semester instructors and highlights of the upcoming side trip speaker series.

The reception is free and open to the public, but registration is required. To register, visit

Upon registration, participants will receive an email with the Webex link and instructions how to join.

Since the first world's fair in 1851, these spectacles of modernity have attracted well over a billion visitors. In his keynote address, Rydell will discuss the history of world's fairs, focusing on American exhibitions and examine some of the reasons why world's fairs have recently fallen out of favor in the U.S. but may be on the cusp of making a comeback. Robert W. Rydell is one of the

leading authorities on the history of international exhibitions (sometimes called world expos or world's fairs). He is the author of multiple books and essays about the subject. Rydell has served as guest curator for

## MOR features marine-based showcase of creatures past

Museum of the Rockies has turned its calendar to a new year, joining the rest who hope 2021 will bring about better fortunes. As we await a return to business as usual. MOR will house a new exhibit for curious minds later this month: Savage Ancient Seas opens

January 23rd. Walk beneath what must be the fossil version of the Loch Ness Monster; a 42-foot-long Elasmosaurus. Dive into an ancient underwater world 70 million years ago when carnivorous fish and giant sea reptiles swam a vast, shallow sea spanning North America. See more than 50 prehistoric marine skeletons, many on display for the first time in Montana! While dinosaurs ruled the land, these strange, spectacular creatures ruled the sea.

In partnership with Triebold Paleontology, Inc., Museum of the Rockies will create an ancient underwater environment where visitors will experience enormous, vicious sea monsters of the Cretaceous Period. The exhibition includes numerous prehistoric marine fossils, both cast and real specimens, mounted in extraordinary three-

dimensional displays. The skeletons are mounted dramatically, many suspended from the ceiling above, immersing visitors inside a fearsome ancient ecosystem.


Highlights include:

A 45-foot-long Tylosaurus, the largest mosasaur skeleton ever found in North America

The largest turtle that ever lived, Archelon, an enormous sea turtle with a 17-foot flipper span

Flying reptiles the size of hanggliders: Pteranodon, fly overhead with wingspans over 11 feet

The vicious and large "X-fish,"



### Online military exhibit available to view on YGM website

Yellowstone Gateway Museum has curated a new online exhibit, "Honoring Park County Veterans: A Military History." The showcase tells the stories of Park County servicemen and women from Civil War to present day, including the Spanish American Philippine War, World War I, World War II, Korean War, Vietnam War, and the Iraq War.

Beyond individual veteran's biog-

raphies, the exhibit highlights the challenging experiences of local residents and Montana issues during World War I, including sedition, drought, and the Spanish flu pandemic; and stories of the homefront, women, and Yellowstone National Park during World War II.

The military exhibit is the third online exhibit now available, making history more accessible to people who are unable to climb stairs or

who are looking for a rich experience from the comfort of their couch. Exploring Yellowstone through ART and Glimmers of History, a weekly post on Facebook and Instagram, are also offered.

# **Emerson array exhibits Indigenous art**

While snow drapes the Gallatin Valley in white, a new group exhibit at the Emerson Center for the Arts & Culture offers a colorful and creative respite. "We Are Still Here and This Is Our Story" opens in the Jessie Wilber, Lobby and Weaver Room galleries January 8th.

Co-curated and featuring work by Indigenous women artists, the impactful exhibit intends to bring awareness to our nation's Missing and Murdered Indigenous People.

This crisis is prevalent and widespread in North America yet its significance has been diminished for far too long. In 2016, almost 6,000 cases were recorded, a figure that is considered low due to underreporting and inadequate data. The recently passed Savanna's Act is proposed to address some of these jurisdictional issues in respect to Indian Country and the failings of the law relating particularly to Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women & Girls. The fight for recognition and support continues. We as a nation have a duty to speak out against injustice and ineffective law enforcement response to this widespread and critical loss of human life.

Participating artists include: Della Big Hair Stump, Cedar Bulltail, Grace Bulltail, Wozek Chandler, Monica Gilles-Brings Yellow, Rebekah Jarvey, Nayana LaFond, Carrie Moran McCleary, Salisha Old Bull, Susan Stewart and Olivia Rose Williamson.

The Emerson has provided a platform for these women artists to

share their stories through contemporary art, beadwork, and fashion design. MMIP has impacted the entire Indigenous community with too many experiencing losses first hand. Please listen and lift up your voice to raise awareness and bring peace to these Native families.

Contributing artists will showcase their work in each of the Emerson galleries through Feb. 28th. Masks and social distancing are required.

In 2021, funding will be secured to develop this vehicle donation into a mobile "STEAM" truck with field trip options available for schools, small groups and preschools throughout our area. 

### MontanaPBS learn-at-home programming for students returns this winter

As part of its ongoing efforts to support families and educators during the COVID-19 pandemic, MontanaPBS will continue in 2021 to offer its **Learn at Home** broadcast curriculum of educational programming and corresponding free digital resources. The new Learn at Home schedule begins Jan. 4 and will continue through the end of the school year on June 4.

Through Learn at Home, MontanaPBS is dedicating its daytime weekday schedule to educational programming provided by MontanaPBS and the Montana Office of Public Instruction. The 6:30am to 5:30pm weekday schedule includes specific blocks of time for pre-kindergarten through eighth grade and covers subjects including

language arts, social studies, science and math. MontanaPBS' regular primetime schedule is not affected by this change.

"We've revamped our Learn at Home website after a year of learning what works best for our educators and families," said Laura Dick, digital content and marketing manager at MontanaPBS. "We've worked closely with our education team to gather together new curriculum offerings that are even easier to access from our webpage."

MontanaPBS has also curated corresponding free digital content for the Learn at Home programming to better serve educators across the state. Aligned to the

### FWP taking comments on proposed commercial bait seining waterbodies

From Montana Fish, Wildlife & Parks (FWP) At its December meeting, the Fish and Wildlife Commission endorsed the proposed list of approved waterbodies for **commercial** 

A commercial bait seining license is required for anyone 15 years of age or older to seine and transport bait fish for commercial purposes or for anyone who seines for and has in their possession more than 24 dozen nongame bait fish. The commission may designate waters allowed for this purpose and the department describes these waters annually in the Commercial Bait Seining Application Form. Approved seining waters are regularly monitored for invasive species and pathogens and maintain adequate population abundance to accommodate bait collection.

Proposed changes to the approved water-

bodies list include the addition of four waterbodies to allow commercial bait seining, removal of four waterbodies due to conservation concerns or unviable bait fish populations, and additional clarification for two waterbodies. The full list of approved waterbodies and proposed changes can be found at fwp.mt.gov.

### BFS helps viewers escape the present with diverse historical film

Though the vaccine(s) are making their way into the arms of our fellow Americans, the local movie theater remains temporarily closed. But fret not: Bozeman Film Society continues to virtually stream independent titles for cinephiles. Watch safely at home with new films added weekly. Streaming sales directly support BFS. Here's a look at a few new year options.

An encore screening of explosive documentary *Coup 53* is available through January 7th. The film unveils the story of Operation Ajax, the CIA/MI6 staged coup in 1953 in Iran that overthrew the democratically elected Iranian Prime Minister Mohammad Mosaddegh – with consequences that still shape the modern world. Director Taghi Amirani's 10-year tenacious investigation into this covert operation uncovers troves of neverseen-before source material, the recently recovered and uncensored transcript of the British spy who masterminded the coup (Norman Darbyshire), and oral histories of Iranian witnesses to the coup, including a play-by-play from the ousted Prime Minister's head of security. Not Rated with a runtime of 118 minutes.

Classical music biopic *Louis Van* Beethoven is also available until Jan. 7th. Passionate about music, freedom and truth, the famed composer's life was a battle against conventions – a nonconformity that allowed him to build an unparalleled work in the history of music that will last forever. German director Niki Stein's sweeping drama stars Tobias Moretti (The Dark Valley, The German Lesson, A Hidden Life) and Anselm Bresgott (The Most Beautiful Girl in the World) as the great composer. Presented in German with subtitles, the film runs 120 minutes.

Musical drama *Stand!* is available until Jan. 14th. It's 1919. Stefan and his father Mike left family in Ukraine, fleeing for the New World, where they struggle to earn enough to re-unite the family. Stefan is instantly smitten

with the Jewish suffragette neighbor, Rebecca but Rebecca's brother Moishe and Mike oppose the would-be Romeo and Juliet. Returned soldiers, angry at the lack of jobs after the war, violently threaten the city's immigrants, including Emma, the refugee from racial violence in Oklahoma. When a movement develops for workers to leave their jobs in protest, AJ Anderson, a wealthy lawyer, pits all parties against each other in a dramatic and inspirational final stand. The film runs 110 minutes.

Available through Jan. 21st is **Shadow** in the Cloud. While traveling with topsecret documents on a B-17 Flying Fortress, a female WWII pilot (Chloë Grace Moretz) encounters an evil presence on board. A bonkers mash-up of monster movie and World War II drama, the film is Rated R and runs 87 minutes.

Art documentary My Rembrandt opens Jan. 22nd. Rembrandt's paintings have lost none of their appeal in the 350 years since his death. Rembrandt, the grandmaster of intimacy continues rock the art world. 350 years after his death, many people, even entire nations are obsessed with his paintings. Aristocrats cherish, experts rule, art dealers investigate, collectors hunt, museums battle. My Rembrandt provides fascinating insight into what makes the work of this Dutch master technically so extraordinary, and why different people are so deeply affected by his oeuvre, or a specific work. Meanwhile, centuries after Rembrandt's death, his paintings are still a source of drama and gripping plot twists. Not Rated, the film runs 97 minutes.

Cost and rental period vary per title. Public film screenings at the Ellen will resume when large gatherings can be safely scheduled. Follow BFS on social media for updates. Visit bozemanfilmsociety.org for film previews and further information and "Keep 'Em Flickering!" •







### Ale Works' popular dinner & brew pairings extended for off-season

When Montana Ale Works rolled out its Perfect Pairings Series last September, outdoor dining was still in full swing. With "The Space to Keep You Safe" indoors or out, Ale Works had built a deep well of trust for their dedication to COVID protocols. But once weather forced Bozeman diners inside for real, would they even go out for meals anymore?

Time has told the tale, and as 2020 recedes into the rearview, Ale Works' Perfect Pairings have proven the perfect antidote to COVID doldrums. They are an opportunity to gather, casually, monthly, safely, around affordable multi-course, multi-pint events that pair fine food and local beer in the spacious environs of the East End's restored Northern Pacific freighthouse.

What was far from a sure thing just a few months ago has become a highly anticipated monthly event that sells out nearly as soon as tickets go on sale. Ale Works recently announced that Perfect Pairings will be extended through the winter

"People are stoked to have something to look forward to again," says Dawn Brown, Ale Works' longtime office manager, HR expert, and events coordinator. "Perfect Pairings fill that void of getting to attend a fun event, but in a safe and responsible way." Adds Chef de Cuisine, Jacob Huder, "The best thing about the pairings is making people smile and giving them the opportunity to forget all the craziness for a few hours.'

Roth Jordan, one of four Ale Works partners, agrees. "We wanted from the beginning to keep this approachable and affordable, and I

think we've done that. We always add a few surprises too, so really it's six courses with beer (and/or spirits) for around \$50. It's just so nice to be able to do this in these times. And we're selling tables, not seats, so you only sit with who you came with.'

The creative team includes a local brewer and/or distiller, Ale Works partners Sean Faris, Jordan, and Mark and Christin Taché, Chef Huder, and Bar Manager Brad Harris. They taste and choose beers at the brewery before they start talking food, generally building the dishes to go with the beers, not the other

"Once the theme is picked and I have tasted the beers, I have a decision to make," says Huder. "Should I pair the food by contrasting it with the beer, or bring a specific flavor out in the beer or food, complementing them? Then the dish kind of evolves into the final version from there."

The restaurant's first event, October's Autumn BBQ and Brews, was a collaboration with Bozeman Brewing Co. and included House-Smoked Pork Belly, BBO'ed Lion's Mane Mushrooms, and Burnt-End Beef Brisket Ravioli, paired with a range of BBC beer stylings. November's Southern Comfort featured Low-Country Southern Cuisine (Chef Huder's specialty from his dozen years chef'ing in Charleston, South Carolina), a collaboration with Outlaw Brewing Co. French Bistro Night in December paired Union Hall Beers and Bozeman Spirits cocktails with classic Parisian fare.

An evening in Paris sound a tad hoity-toity for Bozeman? Consider this: Following the 2nd course of

bone marrow with onions, fried parsnips and bacon jus, scooped directly from the bone onto pastry chef Libby Klahn's sourdough bread, the "Intermezzo" (or palate cleanser) that followed had guests tip their Bobcat Boulevardier Luge Shot directly into the bone and down the hatch. How much mini cocktail luge'ed into mouths and how much crash-landed into laps remains an ongoing matter of debate.

Ale Works' first 2021 pairing will be a multi-course tour of high alpine cuisines – Italian Dolomites, Swiss Alps, Andes and Himalayas – in collaboration MAP Brewing Co. (Tickets for the Jan. 12 event are likely already sold out.)

In the end, the pairings are perfect for two reasons: they are straight up fun for the chefs, the brewers and the community, and because Ale Works and their guests take COVID safety protocols seriously. Tables of two to six diners agree to remain seated throughout the evening, except when heading to the head, bemasked of course.

"Dinners like these are why chefs become chefs, and why I fell in love with this business," says Jordan. "It's amazing to see people enjoying themselves so much, in a safe way, at a restaurant right now. You almost forget that COVID is going on! And I love people's reaction to the pairings. Everyone's palate is different, so guests at the same table can debate their thoughts and opinions. It's way better than talking politics!" Amen to that.

### Lead scientist in MSU's **COVID-19 testing lab to give** provost's lecture

by Reagan Colyer, MSU News Service Montana State University's annual Provost's Distinguished Lecturer Series will continue virtually on Tuesday, January 12 with a tour of the university's COVID-19 testing lab by one of its

Seth Walk, an associate professor in the Department of Microbiology and Immunology in the College of Agriculture, has a background in studying microbial ecology, with an emphasis on microbes that have direct impact to human health. While much of his research focuses on the microbes that inhabit the human gut, he and many members of his team pivoted their focus in July to a partnership with the State of Montana to increase the state's capacity for processing COVID-19 tests.

"Very early on in the pandemic, we tried to identify machines and instruments that could be borrowed from labs around campus, as well as purchasing a few more, to be able to conduct COVID-related research," said Walk, who joined MSU's faculty in 2013. "The state then reached out in July, and I was asked to lead the effort to get some testing capacity at MSU up and running.'

MSU's testing lab, funded by the federal CARES Act, was initially contracted to process 30,000 COVID-19 tests between July and December. Walk says that by the lab will have far exceeded 100,000 processed tests by the end of 2020. Walk's lecture will include a vir-

tual walking tour of the COVID-19 lab, filmed in partnership with Montana PBS, in which he explains the sample testing process. The virtual event will also feature a one-onone interview between Walk and MSU Provost Bob Mokwa and an overview of the research that takes place in the Walk Lab when it's not engaged in COVID-19 testing. Before moving into processing

COVID-19 tests, Walk's team worked alongside associate professor Blake Wiedenheft and other scientists to help test wastewater in communities around Gallatin County for the presence of COVID-19, which helped identify where the virus was spreading in those communities.

Walk's Distinguished Provost Lecture will stream live and for free at 7pm on Jan. 12 on MSU's website at https://www.montana.edu/ pdl/. A recording of the lecture will be available to watch after the initial



## Recreational marijuana gets the tentative green light in Montana

Election Day saw a majority of Montana voters give the stamp of approval to a pair of initiatives that broaden the legal use of marijuana in the Treasure State. One of those initiatives, I-190, will allow the state Department of Revenue to approve applications for the sale of recreational marijuana with an additional tax attached.

Currently, the Montana Medical Marijuana Program, ran by the Dept. of Health and Human Services, is only available for those citizens who qualify to be cardholders. Unlike the medical marijuana program, I-190 only legalizes possession for adults 21 and over.

The newly seated state legislature is expected to address the ini-

tiative during the coming session, which begins on Jan. 4. If adopted into law, I-190 will allow the Dept. of Revenue to "license and regu-

late the cultivation, transportation and sale of marijuana and marijuana-infused products, and will

inspect premises where marijuana



is cultivated or sold." Applicable licenses will be accepted beginning October 1st of this year.

I-190 comes with a huge earn-

ings incentive for the state, its 20% tax on recreational marijuana projected to add roughly \$48M in annual revenue by 2025.

As stated in the offi-

cial ballot language, "10.5% of the tax revenue goes to the state

general fund, with the rest dedicated to accounts for conservation programs, substance abuse treatment, veterans' services, healthcare costs, and localities where

marijuana is sold." The initiative also allows those serving sentences for acts permitted by I-190 the possible eligibility for resentencing or expungement.

Further details regarding licensing and implementation will be announced by the Montana Dept. of Revenue in the coming months.

### Yellowstone's winter season begins

Yellowstone National Park is now open to the public for travel by snowcoach and snowmobile. Through mid-March, visitors can travel the park's interior roads on commercially guided snowmobiles and snowcoaches from the North, West, East and South entrances, weather-permitting. Visitors who have proper permits can also take non-commercially guided

The park annually opens roads in mid-December to oversnow travel only. Winter travel ends in mid-March when plowing crews begin to clear a winter's worth of snow. Roads will start to re-open to automobiles in mid-April.

The one exception is the road from the park's North Entrance at Gardiner, Montana, through Mammoth Hot Springs to Cooke City, Montana. This road is plowed and open to automobiles all year.
