#### Livingston Depot opens for new season with 'Invisible Boundaries'

Depot Museum is now open for the summer season. Visitors are welcome

Monday through Saturday from 10am to 5pm. The featured exhibit for the 2020 summer season is groundbreaking presentation **"Invisible Boundaries: Exploring** Yellowstone's Great Animal Migrations."

Curated by the Buffalo Bill Center of the West in Cody, Wyoming, it uses art, science, cartography and multimedia to delve into the challenges and triumphs of herds as they cross geographic, cultural, ecological and political boundaries.

The stunning multi-media experience combines the research of

wildlife biologist Arthur Middleton, PhD, on the migration of thousands of elk in the Greater Yellowstone Ecosystem, the captivating photography of Joe Riis, the striking paintings and drawings of James Prosek, and the gripping film produced by Jenny Nichols.

Wildlife biologist Arthur Middleton, PhD, compiled over a decade of tracking collar data to produce the basis for an interactive map featured in the exhibit - visitors can adjust the map to reflect different seasons, herds, geographical features and political boundaries. The multi-disciplinary team has created an ecosystem-wide overview of

animals including elk, pronghorn, mule deer and more.

Livingston is the final stop on a limited tour of the exhibit including the Yale Peabody Museum and the Natural History Museum of Utah, offering the experience to brand new audiences.

The Depot's popular ongoing main exhibit "Rails Across the **Rockies: A Century of People** & Places" will also be on display. A detailed O-Scale model of the entire Depot complex was recently donated by Duane Danielson and refurbished for display by the Livingston Model Railroaders.

The accuracy of the complex is unparalleled. Danielson tracked down copies of the Depot's original blueprints from the Northern Pacific Railway Historical Association. He then teamed up with a CAD (computer aided design) specialist to digitally render the drawings and laser

cut the walls, windows, and columns. Danielson spent months assembling the pieces and adding detailing like bricks, monads, a bustling ticket booth, and even a secretary pool huddled over their typewriters on the third floor.

In addition to its main exhibit. the museum also presents

"The Livingston Depot in History and Architecture," and "Film in Montana:

Moviemaking Under the Big Sky," as well as an annual featured special exhibit.

#### New viking exhibit supplements MOR favorites this summer

Joining its prehistoric Siebel Dinosaur Complex, a venturesome showcase has planted its flag at Museum of the Rockies for the summer. The Vikings Begin is now open and will be on display through mid-September.

The exhibition includes magnificent weapons, both for attack and defense, but also smaller treasures such as jewelry and objects of magical importance. To understand the story of how the Vikings began, the exhibition looks at their relationship with the outside world, their spiritual and magical beliefs, the role of warfare, the importance of water and waterways, and how trade routes influenced their world.

Based on cutting-edge research by Neil Price, Charlotte Hedenstierna-Jonson and John Ljungkvist, the exhibition is the premiere of a collection that has only been outside of Scandinavia a

few times. With Viking helmets, swords, and weapons for attack and defense, as well as jewelry, glass vessels, bowls, the artifacts tell stories both about the society and the people buried with them.

The exhibition is divided into thematic sections on Viking warfare, maritime trade, a ship burial, Norse gods, the Baltic Sea and geopolitical relationships to other cultures, shedding new light on how early Viking society was organized, the role of women, and the development of maritime innovation that enabled the Vikings to reach faraway lands in the East and the West.

The Vikings Begin is produced by the Gustavianum, housed in Sweden's Uppsala University

MOR's Living History Farm is also open for the summer season, allowing visitors to experience what life was like in the Treasure State

more than 100 years ago.

In 1989, the Tinsley House was relocated to Museum, bringing with it the history of Montana's homesteading era. Skilled costumed interpreters will take you back in time as they cook over a woodburning stove, demonstrate cooking skills and recipes from the 1890s, tend to the Heirloom Garden, and forge iron in the blacksmith's shop. Take time this summer to enjoy the beautiful sights of the garden, the smells of home cooking, and the history of a time gone by that lives on todav.

The Living History Farm is included with Museum admission. Hours are 10am-4pm daily, through August.





Largest single day giving event in Montana has a record-breaking year

Between May 6th and 7th, the Gallatin County community came together for the record-breaking 7th annual Give Big Gallatin Valley, One Valley Community Foundation's 24-hour giving event that raises unrestricted funds for local nonprofits. This vear, 6,240 generous donors gave \$2,635,802 to support 210 organizations, raising nearly \$835,000 more than the previous year. Since its inception in 2015, Give Big has helped raise over \$8.4 million for nonprofits located in or serving Gallatin Valley.

"We continued to be amazed at the generosity of this region," said Bridget Wilkinson, Executive Director of the One Valley Community Foundation. "Each year, we see an incredible outpouring of support for our local nonprofit sector through Give Big and it's so humbling to see that level of investment in our nonprofits year over year."

HAVEN, a local nonprofit committed to reducing the incidence and minimizing the impact of domestic abuse on families and communities, has participated in Give Big every year. "We were blown away by the overwhelming support from our community during Give Big 2021," added Sofie Garcelon, Development Director for HAVEN. "Our nonprofits have come to rely on this event for essential operating funds, and we are beyond grateful for the One Valley Community Foundation for orchestrating Give Big. To all of the staff, board members, donors, partners, businesses, and the entire Gallatin Valley community, thank you! We could not do this

work without you."

Due to COVID-19, many local nonprofits have had to cancel important fundraising events, increase services, furlough staff, reduce salaries, and suspend income-generating programs. These challenges made this year's event the most important to date.

"This year, donations through Give Big were critical to our nonprofits that have seen an increase in demands on their services due to COVID-19 and the tremendous growth of our region," said Wilkinson.

Give Big is unique as it highlights organizations of all sizes from different areas throughout the county. This diversity is celebrated through prizes such as the small, medium and large nonprofit prizes and the community celebration prizes. In total, over \$20,000 worth of prizes were awarded to nonprofits throughout the day to maximize the impact of each donation.

Stevie Croisant, the founder of We are Her, a nonprofit that was awarded a Kickoff Prize and a Newcomer Award said, "We Are HER is a small nonprofit – we just don't have the capacity to pull off a fundraiser of this size on our own. Because of Give Big and the team at One Valley Community Foundation, We Are HER was able to raise enough money to support all of 2021 programming, including the addition of our 2021 Retreat. We love the Gallatin County community and we're so grateful for this opportunity to add more members to the We Are HER family through Give Big."





Sixty acres are used for the state-certified campground, which holds 1,200 20x40 sites. Within the venue is a 12-acre arena where all the magic happens. Live music from national and local acts plays all day and into the night. Aside from the music, festivalgoers can enjoy horseshoe tournaments, dance contests, mechanical bull riding, as well as food and merchandise vendors. •
