Bozeman’s only pay-what-you-can restaurant & food truck more popular than ever

Whether paying-it-forward or paying-what-you can, the number of customers using HRDC’s **Fork & Spoon** restaurant and **The Mighty Spork** food truck noticeably increased in 2021.

With the addition of the food truck and an expanded take-and-bake program at the restaurant, HRDC’s chef-prepared food offerings have proven to be a big draw for people on the go. It’s no surprise that the meals receive rave reviews with seasonal offerings such as roasted squash soup, turkey pot pie and cranberry orange bread pudding at Fork & Spoon.

Fork & Spoon is open for dinner Sunday through Thursday and convenient take-and-bake meals Monday through Thursday from 5–7pm. Nightly dinners can be prepared to go and fresh-frozen meals are also available for pick-up during these times as well. On Fridays,

walk-in service is available from noon–6pm to either pick up a to-go meal or something from the freezer to warm up later. A rotating menu and guest chefs ensure there is something tempting for everyone.

As Montana’s only pay-what-you-can restaurant, HRDC’s Fork & Spoon provided 25,509 meals to community members last year. Both paying customers and organizations like the Yellowstone Club Community Foundation (YCCF) help HRDC continue its meaningful work of combating hunger and food insecurity across Gallatin Valley. Additional funds have been extended by the YCCF to

support the missions of local non-profits.



“The result of this generosity is two-fold when it comes to renting out the dining room at Fork & Spoon, or when catering is acquired through Fork & Spoon or The Mighty Spork Food Truck,” noted

Rick Hilles, HRDC’s Program Manager for both the restaurant and food truck. “Not only does YCCF’s support help encourage the use of HRDC’s food and nutrition providers, it also helps other area nonprofits defray

their meeting and event costs – an economic boost for all involved.” Reservations for facility rental or catering can be made by contacting forkandspooncatering@thehrdc.org. In addition to providing so many

tempting options for the greater community to enjoy, these programs all contribute toward helping our neighbors in need. Heather Grenier, HRDC’s President and CEO, summarizes the struggle some of our neighbors are facing this way:

“Nobody wants to be hungry. But everybody wants to pay their rent or mortgage. And here, in this valley, doing so often means that you are doing so at the expense of other necessities. Whether that is food or medication or snow tires, something is being spared. Even with the swift local recovery happening among numerous sectors, some sectors are lagging far behind leaving many in our community with lingering financial challenges.”

Plus: Real Lives + Real Engineering open January 22nd and will be on display into spring. A members-only preview event will be held the evening prior. Here’s a closer look at what’s in store.

The birth of the modern car occurred over 150 years ago in

Germany. The first internal combustion, a petroleum-fueled motorcycle came out of Germany 25 years later. In the United States, Henry Ford Company was established in 1901. A year later it morphed into Cadillac Motor Company which Ford left, along with the rights to his name. A new Ford Motor Company emerged in 1903 in Detroit with backing from a dozen investors, including the Dodge brothers.

The same year, Harley-Davidson, was founded in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. Its chief rival was the Indian Motorcycle Co. which emerged out of a bicycle manufacturer in Springfield, Massachusetts in 1901. Much has changed since those early automotive years, but perhaps nothing more so than America’s love affair with cars and motorcycles, which has expressed itself culturally and artistically in so many ways.

Visitors can ride a mono-ski in a simulated ski race, control a DJ station using the wheels of a wheelchair, “feel” the music with a special touch panel, engineer solutions to unique design challenges and even discover how someone can control a neuroprosthetic limb with their thoughts.

Human Plus also showcases compelling stories from a unique field of engineering.

Montana Shakespeare in the Parks announces winter performances

From plays to sonnets, the production shares Shakespeare’s best, according to MSIP. The fast-firing comedy attempts to prove that three actors can act through Shakespeare’s entire canon of 37 plays in 90 minutes. The winter show launches the start of Montana Shakespeare in the Parks’ 50th season, an anniversary the program will celebrate all year long.

MSIP is an outreach program of the MSU College of Arts and Architecture.

“The 2021 season of MSIP was very exciting for us. We were thrilled to be once again performing

in person for the communities we treasure so much,” said Kevin Asselin, executive artistic director of MSIP. “Now that our 50th year is upon us, we couldn’t be more eager to announce our winter show with an energy-packed production that speaks to the spiritedness of Shakespeare and to the passion we have going into 2022.”

Performances will be held in the Black Box Theatre, located in the Visual Communications Building at 11th and Grant on MSU’s campus. Show dates are January 20th–30th. Thursday, Friday and Saturday performances begin at 7:30pm, with a 2:30pm matinee to follow on both Sundays. General admission tickets are \$25 and reserved seats are \$35. Acclaimed doc profiles journalism in the face of incredible odds

On Thursday, January 6th, at the Emerson Center for the Arts & Culture, the Bozeman Doc Series presents the Montana premiere of the multiple-award winning new documentary, ***Writing with Fire***. The film screens at 7pm.

Reporting from a social environment built to divide based on caste and gender, a fearless group of journalists maintain India's only women-led news outlet. The women of Khabar Lahariya ('Waves of News'), all from the Dalit ("untouchables") caste, prepare to transition the newspaper from print to digital even though many of their reporters don't have access to electricity at home. Armed with smartphones, Chief Reporter Meera and her team of investigative journalists confront some of India's biggest issues – exposing the relentless discrimination against women and amplifying the voices of those who suffer from the oppressive caste system.

Writing with Fire chronicles the astonishing determination of these local reporters as they empower

each other and hold those responsible for injustice to account. Reaching new audiences through their growing platform, the women of Khabar Lahariya redefine what it means to be powerful in this timely and inspiring documentary.

Writing with Fire world-premiered at this year's Sundance Film Festival, where it won the Audience Award in the World Cinema Documentary category as well as the Special Jury Award: Impact for Change.

BFS films explore relationships of stark contrast with current offerings

Public film screenings are back in full swing with Bozeman Film Society. An upcoming Ellen event has been announced as part of the 2021-22 Season, and virtual films are still available to screen for cinephiles at home.

Next up, BFS screens **C'mon C'mon** starring Joaquin Phoenix and Woody Norman. The event is set for 7pm on Wednesday, January 12th at the Ellen Theatre.

Johnny (Phoenix) and his young nephew (the astonishing Norman) forge a tenuous but transformational relationship when they are unexpectedly thrown together in this delicate and deeply moving story about the connections between adults and children, the past and the future. From writer-director Mike Mills (*20th Century Women*, *Beginners*), the film is Rated R and runs 108 minutes.

Local dispensary offers details of recreational cannabis in Montana

Recreational sales in Montana begin on January 1st, 2022! Whether you’re new to the cannabis world or have been involved in the medical side of the industry, the staff at **Ganja Goddess** is excited to answer any questions you may have as the new year approaches.

Here are a few important basics everyone should know:

- Adults 21 or older are allowed to carry/purchase 1 ounce or equivalent in cannabis products beginning Jan. 1st, 2022.
- All cannabis products must be child resistant OR transported in a child resistant bag.
- Recreational marijuana will be

taxed at 20% of retail sales. Medical marijuana will continue to be taxed at 4% of retail sales. Local jurisdictions may add an additional tax of up to 3%. For example, Ganja Goddess has five locations – Bozeman, Livingston, Butte, Helena and Missoula – and depending on which county you’re shopping in, there may be a 3% sales tax depending on what the people voted.

- As dispensary owners with a full line of Ganja Goddess CBD products, these will unfortunately not be available in-store. We have spent the last 4 years formulating and making sure we offer the best and most effective CBD products to our customers. We find this new

rule heartbreaking for many dispensary owners and our loyal customers. Medical and recreational dispensaries are not allowed to sell CBD products; however, those products can be sold by other businesses or can be purchased online. At Ganja Goddess, we hope this will change as we have many customers who will now have to purchase their CBD online instead of picking up locally. To sell CBD, Ganja Goddess, like many other dispensary owners will have to sell under an entirely different company or business. You can find our CBD products online under our new sister company that we have branded, GGMT CBD.

- If you are traveling from one county to another and transporting any marijuana products you will need to check with the specific county on their rules and regulations regarding their specific laws and regulations.
- Edible adult-use marijuana products may contain up to 10mg of THC per serving, and up to 100mg of THC in an entire package. In general, the total THC of marijuana flower may not exceed 35%. Topical products may contain no more than 6% THC and no more than 800mg of THC per package. A marijuana product sold as a capsule, transdermal patch or suppository, may contain more than 100mg

of THC, and no more than 800 mg of THC in an entire package. Again, these limits do not apply to medical marijuana cardholders.
