# Climbing doc showcases Nepali woman's summiting of Everest

On Sunday, May 15th, at the Emerson Center for the Arts & Culture, the Bozeman Doc Series and Bozeman Sunrise Rotary Club present the Montana premiere of the critically acclaimed new documentary, **Pasang: In the Shadow of Everest**. The film screens at 7pm.

The documentary chronicles Lhamu Sherpa's tragic and inspiring journey to become the first Nepali woman to summit Everest in 1993. As an uneducated, indigenous woman and a Buddhist in a Hindu kingdom, Pasang's dream to scale the legendary mountain pits her against family, foreign climbers, her own government, and nature itself. Her determined pursuit of Everest plays out within the context of her nation's quest for democracy and the emergence of the commercial climbing industry. As told by the Nepalis who knew her, by some of

the world's most notable alpinists, and by Pasang herself, the film documents her historic quest that would transfix her country and uplift a new generation's belief in its possibilities.

Moms Like Me originated in response to a postpartum tragedy that rocked the Bozeman community in early 2016, and has since become a well-loved, community centered event for families in the greater Bozeman area to raise awareness about perinatal mental health, normalize the expectations of the perinatal period, and strengthen support networks for our growing community.

The time has always been now to celebrate mothers and through the dedication to this ever-evolving, annual event, along with on-going support groups and workshops for new families, to the yearly printing and distribution of the “Roots Perinatal Resource Guide,”

local non-profit Roots Family Collaborative has stepped in to fill a glaring void by becoming the trusted connection point for both families and providers from pregnancy through early parenthood.

Alongside its famed Siebel Dinosaur Complex, a new exhibit moves into Museum of the Rockies this summer. **Apsáalooke Women & Warriors** opens May 28th and will be on display until early September.

The Apsáalooke [ap-SAH-loo-gah] people of the Northern Plains are known for their bravery, artistry, and extravagance. Celebrate the prominence of women, daring feats in battle, unparalleled horsemanship, and innovative beadwork.

Alongside historical war shields and regalia, contemporary Native American art highlights how this bravery and artistry is alive today.

A visiting exhibit from Chicago's Field Museum, *Apsáalooke* explores the history, values, and beliefs of this Native American community known for their horsemanship, artistic pursuits, and matriarchal ways of life, and honors the tradition of “counting coup” – performing acts of bravery. Visitors will learn about Apsáalooke origins, cultural worldviews, and the powerful roles that both women and warriors hold in the community through a unique mix of traditional objects and contemporary Native American pieces from the perspective of guest curator Nina Sanders.

MOR's **Living History Farm**

also opens for the summer season on May 30th, allowing visitors to experience what life was like in the Treasure State more than 100 years ago.

In 1989, the Tinsley House was relocated to Museum, bringing with it the history of Montana's homesteading era. Skilled costumed interpreters will take you back in time as they cook over a wood-burning stove, demonstrate cooking skills and recipes from the 1890s, tend to the Heirloom Garden, and forge iron in the blacksmith's shop. Take time this summer to enjoy the beautiful sights of the garden, the smells of home cooking, and the history of a time gone by that lives on today.

The Living History Farm is included with Museum admission. Hours are 11am–5pm, Monday through Saturday, and noon–5pm on Sunday.

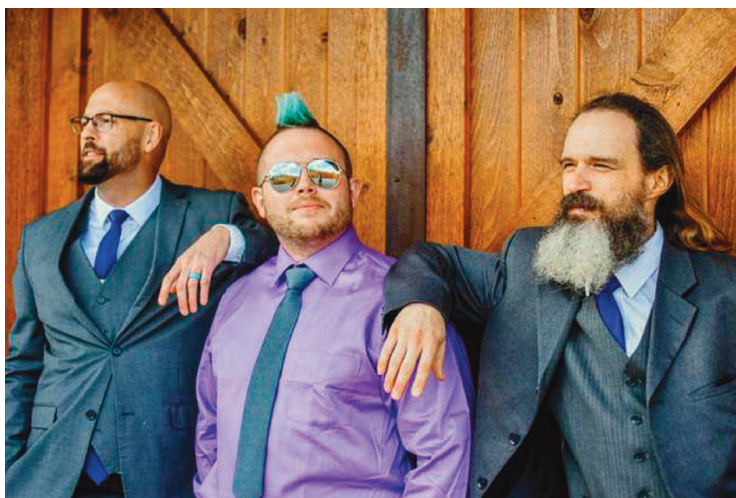
