Russian Nobel Peace Prize winner tells MSU students they hold key to world peace, free speech

Dmitry Muratov, a Russian free speech activist and 2021 recipient of the Nobel Peace Prize, told a select group of Montana State University students on Wednesday that his hope for a better world lies with their generation.

“I have no hope in anyone with the exception of 20-, 25-, 30-year-olds,” Muratov said through an interpreter during a mid-day question-and-answer session in the Strand Union Building. “Your generation is connecting to the future.”

Muratov is founder and editor-in-chief of *Novaya Gazeta*, an independent Russian newspaper that has reported on government corruption and human rights since 1993. Since 2000, six journalists working for the paper have been killed, believed to have been targeted for their investigative work.

When asked by a student if, looking back on his career, he would do anything differently, Muratov spoke about wanting to shut the paper down after the reporters were killed.

“If we had been a little smarter or more cautious, some of the journalists could have been saved,” Muratov said. “Even the best reporting, the most important investigations, are not worth their lives.”

Novaya Gazeta has continued to publish, despite having its print and online media licenses in Russia rescinded. The paper’s reporting is disseminated via email and on YouTube, which “somehow has not yet been blocked in Russia, but it’s going to be – it’s just a matter of time,” Muratov said.

According to Muratov, since the outbreak of the war in Ukraine a year ago, the Russian government has shut down all independent media outlets. Thousands of journalists, he said, have been forced to leave the country, many labeled “enemies of the state, foreign agents or undesirables.”

Merely uttering the word “war” in Russia is a criminal offense, he added, and nobody seems to be immune to prosecution.

“That’s why, my friends, free speech is mutually exclusive with war – war is impossible when there is free speech,” he said. “In order to start a war, you have to shut down free speech and silence alternate forms of information.”

Muratov called the remaining newspapers, along with all 12 federally owned Russian broadcast channels, government propaganda

outlets, and he said their influence is undeniable. After Russia invaded Ukraine, “a split took place within the nation,” he said, adding that Russians 18-40 tend to be radically against the war while the older generations – “products of the propaganda” – support Russian President Vladimir Putin.

“Propaganda is the new religion,” he said.

Though Muratov said he no longer believes that “hope” will effect change, he does believe members of civil society can do so by the assisting the 14 million Ukrainian refugees who need housing and medical services.

He also reminded the students that they have tremendous power to influence public opinion.

“We are standing on the verge of the third world war – where is the young generation of students?” he asked. “Without strong emotion, the public will grow weary and come to accept dictatorship.”

He ended the session by telling the story of a 10-year-old girl in war-torn Ukraine who prayed amid bombed-out ruins for life for herself and her country. He said he would like to see the world’s media outlets, social media platforms and influencers display and broadcast the prayers of that girl and countless other Ukrainian children.

“What’s important to get across to every person is that the life of this child is in your hands,” he told the students. “In that sense, each one of us is media.”

Students who attended the class said Muratov’s remarks about propaganda and the power of free speech to deter war were particularly impactful.

Freshman Gavin Thorson, a chemistry and economics major who speaks Russian and was able to ask a question of Muratov in his own language, said the hour with the Nobel Prize winner was “fantastic,” because he so easily engaged with the students and thoughtfully answered their questions.

“I come from a town of 700 people, and here I was speaking Russian to a 2021 Nobel Prize winner,” said the Mabel, Minnesota native. “I never imagined having an experience like this when I came to MSU.”

Thorson was one of 35 students from a variety of disciplines who were invited to participate in the master class, said Carmen McSpadden, director of the MSU Leadership Institute, which organized Muratov’s visit to campus. The master class was arranged, coordinated and executed by the institute’s student staff, she said. •

Over the next twenty-five years, G. Love would go on to release seven more similarly lauded studio albums with Special Sauce (plus four solo albums on his own), solidifying his place in music history as a genre-bending pioneer with a sound *The New York Times* described as “a new and urgent hybrid” and NPR called a “musical melting pot.”

G. Love’s magnetic stage presence, meanwhile, made him a fixture on festival lineups from Bonnaroo to Lollapalooza, and his relentless appetite for tour and collaboration landed him on the road and in the studio with artists as diverse as Lucinda Williams, Dave Matthews, The Avett Brothers, Jack Johnson, and DJ Logic.

Tanner Usrey takes the stage

Wednesday, March 22nd with music set to begin at 8pm. Advance tickets to this 21+ show are \$20. Doors at 7pm.

The emerging singer/songwriter delivers a vocal styling all his own. Since beginning his career, Usrey has developed into a soulful, Americana-rock artist that heart-wrenching lyrics and soul-touching vocals provide the cherry on top of his unforgettable melodies and hard-hitting sound.

Symphony’s mesmerizing fusion of old & new features choral masterpieces

The Bozeman Symphonic Choir and soprano Janai Brugger join the Orchestra for two mainstays of the sacred choral repertoire March 25th and 26th for Poulenc’s **Gloria and a Funk World Premiere**. Opening the performance is Grammy-nominated composer Missy Mazzoli’s inspired piece dedicated to her father, a Vietnam War soldier followed by Emmy award-winning local composer, Eric Funk.

The Montana-born composer’s Symphony No. 6 *Apocalypse-Phoenix Rising* mirrors the story of the mythical phoenix, a bird that renews itself from chaos. Written in 2001 as a response to the September 11th attacks, the piece is now receiving its much-anticipated world premiere.

“It’s exciting for me on a number of fronts, not the least of which is that this performance will happen at home,” says Funk. “I will be home, seated in the audience with friends, family and townsfolk from my native Montana. It’s poignant. AND this is the first work in a five-work symphonic cycle. I love that it will happen here in Bozeman, Montana.”

Also on the program is Poulenc’s *Gloria*, performed by soprano Janai Brugger, the recently featured artist on the February 2023 cover of *Opera News*. In 2012, Brugger won the Metropolitan Opera National Council Auditions and all three First Prizes at Operalia – the Opera Prize, Song Prize and Audience Prize. She has recently performed with Chicago Symphony Orchestra, Philadelphia Orchestra, and Dutch National Opera. Brugger’s 2022-2023 season engagements include performances with the Metropolitan Opera of New York, Los Angeles Opera, Opera Colorado, Opera Theater of St Louis, Detroit Symphony Orchestra, and Bozeman Symphony Orchestra.

Performances will be held in person on Saturday, March 25th at 7:30pm and Sunday, March 26th at 2:30pm, at the Willson Auditorium in Downtown Bozeman. Science lecture explores modern solutions to plastics crisis

“Upcycling in the Age of Plastic” will begin at 7pm. It will be held in MOR’s Hager Auditorium.

Can “upcycling” – the repurposing of existing materials – be the life raft we need to keep us from

drowning in a sea of plastic? Dr. Jennifer Dubois, MSU Professor of Chemistry and Biochemistry, will discuss the critical problems posed by billions of tons of unrecycled or burned plastic waste, and how biochemical upcycling is contributing solutions to these problems.

Following on Wednesday, April 19th, the series continues with **“Building Computers for the Moon & Beyond”** at 7pm.

Why does NASA need custom computers for its missions when computers on earth are everywhere? Dr. Brock LaMeres, MSU

Professor of Computer Engineering, will share his research on building space computers for NASA and his group’s upcoming mission to test an MSU computer on the moon.

Join Fork & Spoon’s Spring fundraiser

HRDC seeks to raise \$1,000 per week for 10 weeks to help fund Bozeman’s only pay-what-you-can restaurant

Over the past eleven years, HRDC’s **Fork & Spoon** restaurant has worked to ensure all community members have a warm meal to eat. Today, the significant rise in food costs has placed additional pressure on individual and household budgets making the restaurant’s pay-what-you-can model a solid tool that can be used to help stretch household incomes.

HRDC is seeking the community’s participation in raising \$10,000 over the course of 10 weeks to help meet the increase in demand at Fork & Spoon. To encourage donor participation, an anonymous donor has generously offered to match every dollar raised up to \$10,000.

Supporters of HRDC and Fork & Spoon realize the direct impact their giving has on others in the community. Forty percent of Fork & Spoon’s

annual operating budget comes directly from community donations, and so far, donations to the restaurant sit at just 23 percent of their overall budget with just 4 months remaining in their fiscal year to raise the difference.

Andy Galloway, program manager, knows first-hand just how far donations go in helping keep the restaurant open for everyone. Without donor support, we would not have been able to serve over 22,000 meals last year, many of which were to those experiencing food insecurity.”

Fork & Spoon operates as a social enterprise in several ways. The pay-what-you-can model generates a nightly income from patrons who are able to pay, which in turn offsets the cost of diners who are only able to make a partial contribution, or in some cases, no contribution toward their meal.

Additional revenue is generated

through the restaurant’s catering and take-and-bake programs which offer a wide variety of delicious, scratch-made meals. When not in use during Fork & Spoon’s business hours, the dining room space is rented to groups for meetings and events while the kitchen space is rented to small entrepreneurial food-related businesses. .

Fork & Spoon is open for dinner Sunday through Thursday from 5–7pm. Nightly dinners can be prepared as take-out orders, and fresh-frozen meals are also available for pick-during these times as well.

Fridays, walk-in service is available from noon to 3pm to pick up to-go meals or something from the take and bake freezer to warm up later. More information about HRDC’s Fork & Spoon restaurant can be found by visiting **www.forkandspoonbozeman.org**, where you can make a donation today. •
