Emerson unveils new springtime exhibits

The Emerson Center for the Arts & Culture is pleased to host its newest shows featuring emerging artists from our community.

Michigan-born ceramic artist **Nathan Goddard** showcases **Subduction**, an array of his work, in the Jessie Wilber Gallery.

Similar to the strata of earth, Nathan's work is comprised of layers, of daily human observations and the geo-historical knowledge that is held inside of clay. "I see making my work as archived memories deep beyond the surface mantle, the earth survives as physical documentation of recollection and reflection," he says. "The act of utilizing clay and earth from specific places therefore, literally and conceptually connects my work to a place of origin and the layers of nostalgia associated with it. Place is my material and my vehicle for addressing these ideas."

Kalispell paint artist **Tessa Heck** unveils **Big Thaw** in the Weaver Room.

The exhibit is a series of contemporary landscapes of Glacier National Park, incorporating bright and bold abstracted shapes. "Created in the depth of winter and huddled around my space heaters in my studio, I was attracted to the hyper pigmented colors that could be found on those miraculous alpenglow evenings, where the neon brightness reminds you spring is coming soon and it hasn't forgotten

you," she says. "Painting can be a lonely process, particularly up in the Northwest corner of Montana. Peering out my window to see the glacial peaks on bluebird days gave me a sense of hope and wonderment."

Birds showing in the Emerson Lobby is an exhibition by paint artist **Victoria Daily**.

Victoria's paintings, which revolve around a deep passion for nature, explore patterns of migration and seasonal change. "Patterns have always appeared to me in nature," she says. "Patterns of the scales on a butterfly's wing or the feather molting patterns of waterfowl. Patterns of migration along the Mississippi Flyway that I watch from the flooded cypress woods. Patterns in the crystal of a snowflake, each one similar but different. I am obsessed with these things to the point that I structure my year around them, seeking to be where they are as they move and appear with the seasons."

Gallatin Valley Circle of Compassion conference explores end of life journey

Gallatin Valley Circle of Compassion invites community members to participate in their annual conference, **"Mountains of Courage: Conversations on Death & Dying."** The single-day conference is designed to explore the end of life journey by providing a relaxed setting for individuals and caregivers to discover available resources, tools and information.

The conference will be held on Saturday, April 6th, at the Best Western GranTree Inn from 9am-4pm. Early registration is encouraged as space is limited. The registration fee includes lunch. Doors open at 8:30am.

Presenters and panelists will include health professionals, spiritual counselors, social workers, community support services and caregivers. Participants will have the opportunity to explore practical issues, emotions, myths and tradi-

tions and learn how to shift the current paradigm. They will learn about practical tools and resources to assist in making informed decisions when faced with end of life issues.

Keynote speaker, Reverend Bodhi Be, is an ordained interfaith minister whose presentation is entitled "Beginners Guide to Aging, Dying & Death in the 21st Century." Bodhi is a funeral director, an end-of-life and bereavement counselor and educator; a hospice volunteer; a teacher and trainer of death doula; a speaker and workshop leader. He has trained hundreds of doctors, nurses, hospice staff, social workers, ministers, chaplains, therapists, artists and lay people in the spiritual, psychological, emotional and logistical care of the dying and care of the dead, and for four years has taken dozens through a certification program for death

doulas. The host for the conference is Gallatin Valley Circle of Compassion (GVCC), a volunteer group of local community members who are professionally and/or personally touched by the human experience of death and dying. Their mission: "Connecting, educating and supporting our community on matters related to death and dying." GVCC's intention for the conference is that participants will feel empowerment, courage, a sense of calm and confidence, and the ultimate realization that one does not have to be alone on this journey.

Conference fees are \$50 with discounted admission for veterans and students. Lunch is included in the cost. CEUs are available. Workshop information, additional conference details, and tickets are available at www.gallatinvalleycircleofcompassion.org. •

French cuisine, NYC art world subject of next BFS titles

Bozeman Film Society continues its season with a screening of the critically acclaimed feature, **The Taste of Things**. The event will be held at Downtown Bozeman's Ellen Theatre on Wednesday, April 10th. Ahn Hung Tran's Cannes winner for Best Director will screen at 7pm.

Set in France in 1889, the film follows the life of Dodin Bouffant as a chef living with his personal cook and lover Eugénie. They share a long history of gastronomy and love but Eugénie refuses to marry Dodin, so the food lover decides to do something he has never done before: cook for her. Starring Juliette Binoche and Benoit Magimel, the film is Rated PG-13

with a runtime of 142 min. "The Taste of Things is not just a sensual experience for the characters, but for the viewer as well. And it goes beyond the food." - *Baltimore Magazine*

Following on Wednesday, May 1st, the Ellen hosts a screening of **Problemista** from director Julio Torres, who also wrote the film's screenplay and is featured in a starring role. The film will be shown at 7pm.

Emmy nominee Julio Torres (*Saturday Night Live*) writes, directs and stars as Alejandro, an aspiring toy designer from El Salvador who dreams of bringing his ideas to New York City - but as his work visa is running out, a job assisting an erratic art-world out-

cast (Tilda Swinton, *Suspiria*) might be his only hope to stay in the country. Rated R, the film runs 98 min.

Deadline Hollywood Daily raves, "Julio Torres takes a simple story about immigration and human connection, and turned it into a comedic, surrealist fantasy that serves as an epic critique of capitalism."

LFS screens theater-based mockumentary

The Livingston Film Series is delighted to present a screening of mockumentary **Theater Camp** on Thursday, April 11th. The film begins at 7pm at the Shane Lalani Center for the Arts.

This loving chronicle of the on and offstage shenanigans at a summer drama camp in the Adirondacks is the movie equivalent of a yarn-and-popsicle-stick weaving your kid brought home from crafts class. *Theater Camp* was co-directed and co-written by one of its stars, *The Bear's* Molly Gordon, based in part on remembrances of her own childhood friendship with co-star Ben Platt. The pair's long-time friend Nick Lieberman co-wrote and co-directed with Gordon,

while Platt's now-fiancé Noah Galvin played the key role of an overworked production manager.

All those crisscrossing real-life connections somehow result not in one of those too-many-cooks comedies that feel like a collection of sketches, but in a cohesive and warmhearted 93-minute tribute to arts pedagogy (think *School of Rock*, but with *Sondheim*) and to the self-serious drama teen who lives within us all. Yes, the mockumentary-style framing device is overfamiliar and distracting, but it falls away after the first few scenes, and the camp's big end-of-summer production *Joan, Still* – a deranged original musical with at least two songs I still burst into at random six months later –

achieves the rare trick of creating a fictional work-within-the-work that is supposed to be really good, and actually is. Written by Dana Stevens, the film is Rated PG-13 with a runtime of 94 min.

Continuing its latest season of screening independent features, documentaries, local films and vintage classics, doors open at 6:30pm with screenings to follow at 7pm. Admission is free, but donations are gratefully accepted. Concessions available. For more information, please visit www.theshanecenter.org.

Doc Series profiles hummingbirds, Grizzly

On Thursday, April 4th, at the Emerson Center for the Arts & Culture, the Bozeman Doc Series continues with the Montana premiere of the critically acclaimed new documentary, **Every Little Thing**. The film screens at 7pm.

Amid the glamour of Hollywood, Los Angeles, a woman finds herself on a transformative journey as she nurtures wounded hummingbirds, unraveling a visually captivating and magical tale of love, fragility, healing and the delicate beauty in tiny acts of greatness.

A film of joy and wonder, *Every Little Thing* offers profound truths in a deceptively simple story. What does it mean to care for another, and what impact does this act have on us? In tending to these fragile yet resilient hummingbirds, Terry Masear finds a sense of healing from her own past. Her diminutive patients – brought into sharp focus through breathtaking, beautifully detailed photography – become memorable protagonists in their own right. The viewer becomes emotionally invested each of them, celebrating their small victories and lament-

ing their tiny tragedies. The compassion and empathy that Masear shows her Lilliputian charges serves as a lesson to us all – a reminder that in the smallest of acts, and in the tiniest of creatures, we might find grace.

Every Little Thing world premiered at the Sundance Film Festival in January to widespread critical acclaim.

"*Every Little Thing* is not just a deeply affecting portrait – it offers a vision of compassion as a way of life. The way Aitken and her ace team have made a handful of these birds, into compelling screen characters is, well, no small thing." – *The Hollywood Reporter*

Following at 7pm on Thursday, April 18th, the new documentary **399: Queen of the Tetons** screens at the Emerson in collaboration with Gallatin Valley Earth Day.

The film follows the life of the most famous bear in the world, Grizzly #399, as she attempts to raise an unusually large litter of four cubs to adulthood. Amidst a warming climate, human encroachment and the looming threat of losing

protected status under the Endangered Species Act, a mother bear makes increasingly unexpected – and consequential – choices to protect her family.

The screening be part of our annual Earth Day event and will be preceded at 5:45pm by a reception in the Emerson ballroom with food and drink, as well as Earth Day information and opportunities from event sponsors Gallatin Valley Earth Day, Broken Ground Permaculture and others. On Monday, April 8th, in Bozeman, Stephen Capra, Executive Director of Bold Visions Conservation, will present his vision for a new **Madison Gallatin Wildlife National Monument**. The event will be held at Bozeman Public Library beginning at 6:30pm and is open to the public. Capra has thirty years' experience in fighting for public lands and threatened wildlife in the west. He spearheaded the creation of two national monuments in New Mexico: Rio Grande del Norte and Organ Mountain Desert Peaks. Capra said "The Yellowstone Ecosystem shelters populations of iconic, threatened wildlife like grizzly bears, wolves, bison, wolverines and bighorn sheep. But it's becoming ever clearer that Yellowstone and Grand Teton parks are not big

enough to assure long term survival of these species. It was here some of these animals made their last stand, and it is from here they need to expand." Phil Knight, long-time advocate for wildlife and public lands from Bozeman, said "We have the largest unprotected roadless area in Montana, the Gallatin Range, right here in our big back yard. Protecting the Gallatins is part of the vision for this national monument. I support this vision for a new national monument. We need to think outside the box and entertain true visionary ideas in a rapidly changing world." The new monument would protect 1.6 million acres of national forest in the Madison and Gallatin ranges and around Island Park Idaho, preserving vast lands that provide essential year round habit

for Yellowstone wildlife. Bold Visions hopes to convince President Biden to set aside this national monument. Capra noted that "The human population of the Yellowstone region is booming and sprawling subdivisions are paving over some of the best wildlife habitat. Meanwhile national forests are getting hampered by a US Forest Service bent on timber extraction and damn the consequences. Recreational use is clashing with wildlife survival. We need a better vision for this Yellowstone landscape where nature still has a chance. That vision is the Madison Gallatin Wildlife National Monument. Cashman Nursery staff will be on hand for advice and tips with "Trees for the Gallatin Valley" at 1pm prior to *Live Raptor Presentations* with Keaton Thomas from the Montana Raptor Conservation Center at 1:30pm and 2:30pm. An additional lecture, "Get to Know the City's Forestry Division," is set for 2pm featuring Alex Nordquest from City of Bozeman Forestry and Lilly McLane

from Gallatin Watershed Council. A special presentation of the Magic Monster Show with Random Acts of Silliness begins at 10am, plus win prizes as part of the children's Earth Day Passport program. The event will also include a petting zoo and face painting booth!

The Gallatin Valley Earth Day event will also see the start of 2024 Bozeman CleanUp Week, set for April 20th-27th. Individuals and groups are encouraged to help pick up litter around Bozeman after a long winter! As the snow melts, we tend to see more trash around our impact our downstream neighbors by helping to keep our streams and rivers clean. Amidst a warming climate, human encroachment and the looming threat of losing protected status under neighborhoods. Not only do cleanups improve habitat for humans and critters within city limits, but they also directly the Endangered Species Act, a mother bear makes increasingly unexpected – and consequential – choices to protect her family.

Science lecture explores the science of light

Illuminate your mind with Gallatin Valley Friends of the Sciences, whose popular lecture series continues with another edition this month. Co-sponsored by Museum of the Rockies and Hopa Mountain, the next talk of the season is set for Wednesday, April 24th. "Telecommunications to Teleportation: Making Light Work" will begin at 6pm. It will be held in MOR's Hager Auditorium.

How do photons – quantum particles of light – enable diverse applications ranging from the well-known to the exotic? Dr. Krishna Rupavatharam, Director of MSU's Spectrum Lab, will address this question in his presentation. He will share his experiences in photonics, the science of light, and how it can be manipulated for applications ranging from remote sensing and holographic imaging to quantum teleportation and communication. He will also provide insights into the growth and evolution of the photonics ecosystem in Montana and innovative research at MSU.

Dr. Rupavatharam holds a Ph.D. in optical physics from the Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore, India. He worked at the

Lund Institute of Technology in Sweden before joining the MSU Spectrum Lab, which he currently directs while developing applications in coherent, microwave and quantum photonics. He has authored numerous technical papers, holds multiple patents in microwave signal processing and coherent lidar, and currently serves as a member of the Board of Directors of the Montana Photonics and Quantum Alliance.

The informative talks will be presented in person on select Wednesdays this spring. The presentations are free and open to the public, with seating on a first-come, first-served basis. Face masks are recommended but not required.

Landfill hosts e-waste recycling event

In honor of Earth Day, the Gallatin Solid Waste Management District and 406 Recycling are again teaming up for a **free electronic waste recycling event** at Logan Landfill. The annual event this year will be on Saturday, April 20th from 8am-2:30pm. The landfill is located at 10585 Two Dog Road.

Accepted items include cell-phones, computers, tablets, batteries, towers, laptops, monitors, printers, TVs, remote controls, scanners, modems, stereo equipment, digital cameras, VCRs, copiers, keyboards, mice and handheld electronics. Data de-

struction on all devices is guaranteed.

People often confuse electronic and electrical waste, which is not accepted through the e-waste program. Common electrical items that will NOT be accepted include blenders, power tools, fans, lamps, hair dryers, curling irons, coffee makers, microwaves, juicers, mixers, toasters and crock pots.

If you're not sure if something is considered e-waste, call (406) 582-2493 for clarification.

Logan Landfill accepts e-waste all year during regular business hours for a fee. Current hours are 7am-5pm Mondays through Fridays, and 7am-4:30pm on Saturdays. The fee is \$27 per ton, with a \$5 minimum for up to 400 pounds. The rate for commercial e-waste recycling is \$48 per ton.
