Depot exhibit inspired by Western tourism

The Livingston Depot Museum opens for the summer season with “Wondrous West: Art, Tourism & National Pride” from curator and historian Lee Silliman. The exhibition of vintage imagery from Silliman’s print collection features advertising campaigns from railroads and travel bureaus spanning nearly a century of America’s romance with Western tourism. The exhibit is now open.

The vast and dramatic landscapes of the Rocky Mountain West came to symbolize the American identity. Presented as its counterpoint to the ancient and richly cultured past of Europe, Americans could point to their unique, diverse and beautiful national parks as emblematic of the country’s greatness. Vintage travel books, railroad brochures, illustrated newspapers, and more than encouraged a nation to “See America First.” Even as rail travel gave way to automobiles, readers were invited to come see what the American West has to offer.

“Wondrous West” will be on display at the Depot Museum through September 7th.

Curator Lee Silliman will offer a unique presentation entitled, “Searching for the Golden West: A History of Western Tourism” on

Thursday, June 6th at 5pm with a reception to follow from 6–8pm at the Depot. Both are free and open to the public.

The popular ongoing main exhibit “Rails Across the Rockies: A Century of People & Places” introduces visitors to the rich history of railroading in Montana. It gives special attention to the Northern Pacific and its central role in the opening of Yellowstone, America’s first national park, through Livingston beginning in the 1880s.

In addition to its main and special exhibit, the museum also presents “Remarkable Migrations,” an adaptation of the groundbreaking exhibit by the Buffalo Bill Center of the West in Cody, Wyoming. The exhibit uses art, science and multimedia to delve into the challenges and triumphs of herds as they cross geographic, cultural, ecological and political boundaries.

Operated by the Livingston Depot Foundation and located at 200 West Park, the Depot is open Monday through Saturday from 10am–5pm. There is a nominal admission, and group visits are also welcome by special arrangement. Additional information can be obtained by visiting www.livingstondepot.org.

MSU Library marks 50th anniversary of Zen

An exhibit marking the 50th anniversary of the publication *Zen and the Art of Motorcycle Maintenance*, the influential best-seller penned by one-time Montana State University instructor Robert Pirsig, is now on display in the Montana State University Library.

Located on the second floor of the library near the entrance to Archives and Special Collections,

the display is open to the public during library hours and will be up through this summer.

With his book, Pirsig motivated a generation to look inward to the “high country of the mind.” Published in 1974 to wide acclaim, *Zen* was inspired in part by events that started between 1959 and 1961, when Pirsig was an English professor at what was then Montana State College, now MSU. The library’s display includes

biographical information about Pirsig, photographs, the briefcase that Pirsig carried while he taught at Montana State, maps of Pirsig-related places on the MSU campus and more. It also includes information about several collections in MSU’s Archives and Special Collections that are connected to Pirsig’s books and his time at MSU.

The farmers’ markets of Southwest Montana bring the locals together in Bozeman, Livingston and communities beyond. Read on to see where you can find garden-fresh produce, fantastic food, novelty items, live entertainment and more over the course of the coming months.

Western Sustainability Exchange’s Livingston Farmers Market summer season commences on Wednesday, June 5th, with Wildfire Preparedness Day. Starting at 4:30 pm at Miles Park Band Shell, next to the Livingston Civic Center, this event is sponsored by the Park County FireSafe Coalition and Sun Mountain Lumber. Attendees will not only learn how to prepare for the upcoming wildfire season but also have the exciting opportunity to meet Smokey Bear, take photos with him, see a fire engine and rescue vehicle, and even spray a firehose. Cole Thorne, the lead singer/songwriter of mountain-island soul band Cole & The Thornes, will provide live music. Her sultry vocals combined with conscious lyrics and Latin-reg-

gae influence make for a laid-back & happy ambiance. A huge thank you to Fairfield Inn & Suites by Marriott and Home2 Suites by Hilton for sponsoring all the music at the Market this season! At 5 pm, the Paradise Permaculture Institute will present a workshop on regenerative gardening. This workshop offers attendees 10 valuable tips that can save time, money, enrich the soil, and encourage perennial food crops. The institute will also share their top 12 plants and their benefits for regenerative gardening and give away a free package of seeds, making this a must-attend event for all gardening enthusiasts. During our music intermission at 6 pm, attendees will enjoy a special performance from the Yellowstone Ballet Company. This summer’s farmers market will run from June 5th through September 18th at the Miles Band Shell Park, rain or shine. Special events will include Kids Day on June 12th, Give A Hoot About the Farmers Market on June 26th, The Cayden Leonard Memorial Bike Rodeo on July 17th, Healthy Soils Day on July 24th, Give A Hoot Grand Finale on July 31st, Art At The Market Day on August 7th, Eat Local Day on August 14th and

Community Health Day on September 4th. River Drive will be closed during the farmers market each week from Yellowstone Street to the Civic Center parking lot, which will remain open for farmers market parking. This is the same closure as previous years and will help provide a safe area for pedestrians and bicyclists and allow the Market to expand into and across the road. Please remember to leave your furry family members at home! Also on June 5th and subsequent Wednesdays, the **Big Sky Farmers Market** takes over Town Center’s Fire Pit Park from 5–8pm. Every year, numerous vendors including local and regional farmers, professional artisans, young artists and entrepreneurs, and community organizations come together to help foster and maintain a market that’s true to Big Sky mountain culture. Expect to find fresh produce, herbs, plants, flowers, baked goods, art, jewelry and clothing, as well as Montana-made products like antler art, woodworking and so much more.

June 15th sees the original **Gallatin Valley Farmers’ Market** open its gates on Saturday mornings from 9am–noon. The market takes place at the Gallatin County Fairgrounds in Bozeman. Serving the community for more than four decades, the popular market provides an opportunity and location for numerous local vendors of homemade food, hand-made crafts and locally grown produce to market, display and sell their goods to promote economic well-being and support the development of home-based businesses.

Beginning June 18th, **Bozeman Farmers’ Market** is back in Park Tuesdays evenings in Lindley Park. Market hours are from 5–8pm. Dedicated to the promotion of local growers, artisans, crafters, nonprofits, small businesses, food artisans and musicians, this local favorite is a fantastic way to support our community. These markets feature fresh produce from local farmers, arts & crafts, dinner options and more. Grab some groceries, get that gift made locally for an upcoming birthday, and kick back with a bite under the summer sky!

Traditionally held on Thursday evenings, the **Belgrade Community Market** has made the difficult decision to postpone its annual events until next summer due to continued construction at Lewis & Clark Park. To next year!

Verge puts comedic spin on amnesia-stricken

Verge Theater is thrilled to present the stage comedy, **Fuddy Meers**, from Pulitzer-winning playwright David Lindsay-Abaire at the Emerson Center for the Arts & Culture. Fuddy Meers follows protagonist Claire (Nicole Wheeler), who has a rare form of psychogenic amnesia

that erases her memory whenever she goes to sleep. There is her chipper husband (Elijah Boyd), her pot-smoking daughter (Isabel Huston), her mother (Katie Mangett) – a recent stroke victim whose speech has been compromised, and a limping and lisping man in a ski mask (Isaac Mills), who pops out from under her bed and claims to be her brother.

Reminiscent of *Groundhog Day* and *Fifty First Dates*, **Fuddy Meers** promises an evening of laughter, hidden identities, and maybe a few tears. This irreverent comedy,

and its assortment of character personalities, is a delightful assault on the senses. It's funny, touching and provocative, a spicy combination that makes for some winning theatre. Due to adult language and themes, this production is recommended for audiences aged 16+.

Tinworks announces '24 exhibition season

This June, Tinworks Art will open its 2024 season, "**The Lay of the Land**," featuring a major new ecological artwork by Agnes Denes and work by five artists inspired by the land of the American West: James Castle, Layli Long Soldier, Lucy Raven, Stephen Shore and Robbie Wing. Tinworks will also host artist-in-residence Wills Brewer, continuing the non-profit art organization's mission to support the creation of new work on site, offering artists the opportunity to expand their practice in experimental ways. The exhibits will open Saturday, June 15th and will be on view into October.

"Being new to Bozeman and the Mountain West, I developed my inaugural season at Tinworks while discovering the communities, cultures and landscape of the region," explains director Jenny Moore. "Learning about this land historically and geologically was the inspiration to bring together artists

whose work is connected to the region and who contend with the land of the west in revelatory ways."

With an intergenerational mix of established and emerging artists, iconic work and newly commissioned installations, 'The Lay of the Land' explores how land in the west is represented. The artworks included connect to land and place through their physical materiality – wheat, sediment, soot, clay, the sound of passing trains – and subject matter – the natural or industrial forces that have shaped the land of the west and depictions of western places shaped by memory or technology.

Agnes Denes' new ecological work is entitled *Wheatfield – An Inspiration. The seed is in the ground*, serves as the touchstone of the season's program. By repurposing the fallow land of Tinwork's field with a stand of wheat that will grow through the summer and be har-

vested and processed into flour in the fall, Denes recenters a presence iconic to Montana, one that has shaped the land, the economy, the culture, and the future of the region. Expanding upon her iconic public artwork, *Wheatfield – A Confrontation* from 1982, Denes' new *Wheatfield – An Inspiration* situates the substantial land at Tinworks' site as a dynamic place to engage issues of current land use and value, encouraging community connections through an invitation by the artist for anyone inspired to plant wheat in fallow land in solidarity with her *Wheatfield* at Tinworks.

"The Lay of the Land" opens June 15th with a special celebration from 6–9pm. The evening will feature live music by Dave Hollier of King Ropes and food for purchase from Taco Montes. Entry is free to all. More information on Denes and other featured artists can be found at www.tinworksart.org. •

MSU Grove hosts Shakes in the Parks opening

Montana Shakespeare in the Parks kicks off their 52nd season with free performances of Shakespeare's **Hamlet**, June 12th–15th, and **The Winter's Tale**, June 19th–22nd. Performances are open to the public and held at 8pm in the MSU Duck Pond Grove, with special pre-show performances taking place beginning at 7pm.

Both productions have elements of comedy and tragedy (and in the case of *Winter's Tale*, a healthy dose of magic). All ages are welcome to attend and enjoy the performances.

Hamlet tells the story of the young prince of Denmark who returns home following the sudden death of his father. The most famous ghost story ever told, Hamlet grapples with the weight of his responsibility to avenge his father's death, to out-manuever his traitorous uncle, and "to be, or not to be." With some of Shakespeare's most memorable lines and iconic

characters, audiences won't want to miss this tale of love and loss, duty vs desire, and the power of performance.

"I do believe that all of Shakespeare's plays are timeless, but *Hamlet* has a point of view that everybody can identify with. I think we are all individually a version of *Hamlet* and can relate to the character on some level," says Kevin Asselin, MSIP Executive Artistic Director and director of *Hamlet*.

As for *The Winter's Tale*, this play spans sixteen years during which a jealous king accuses his wife of infidelity and exiles his newborn daughter to Bohemia where she is raised by shepherds and, ultimately, falls in love with the Bohemian king's son. Audiences are sure to relish this story of love, loss, and forgiveness.

"The play is one of Shakespeare's last, and as such is blessed with a writer who really understood how to manipulate the

form to achieve new heights of storytelling," shares Eva Breneman, Director of *The Winter's Tale*.

This summer, the company performs in 65 communities across five states including Montana, Wyoming, Idaho, North Dakota and Washington, serving the largest number of communities to date. Most events will feature pre-show performances by local artists and audiences are encouraged to bring a picnic to enjoy an evening together under the Big Sky among friends and neighbors.

Ushering Shakespeare's immortal stories of life, love and tragedy into a modern era, MSIP is dedicated to preserving the cultural traditions of theatre and literature through live, professional performances that are free for all people, for all time.

BFS screens hitman drama, crime thriller

Bozeman Film Society continues its season with a screening of the critically acclaimed feature, **Knox Goes Away**. The event will be held at Downtown Bozeman's Ellen Theatre on Friday, June 7th. Written by Gregory Poirier and directed by Michael Keaton, the film will screen at 7:30pm.

After 15 years, the multi-faceted (and Montana neighbor) Keaton returns for his second directorial turn (*The Merry Gentleman*, 2009) with **Knox Goes Away**. As hitman John Knox, Keaton attempts to make amends before his recently discovered dementia takes over. Aided by a trusted friend (Al Pacino) with his own shady past, Knox races against the police – and his own rapidly deteriorating mind – to save his estranged son (James Marsden) from a vengeance-fueled mistake and “cash out” before it's too late.

Keaton is supported by an A-List cast including James Marsden, Al Pacino, Marcia Gay Harden and Ray McKinnon. Rated R, the film runs 114 min.

Garnering positive reviews, *Chicago Sun-Times* critic, Richard Roeper, writes, “The supporting work is stellar, but this is Michael Keaton's film to carry every step of the way, and he turns in a typically fine and layered performance as a man who might find relief in the loss of his memories, given all the dark acts he's committed,” while *Variety's* Owen Gleiberman states the film is “...a noir that holds you exactly the way a noir should, it may be one of the best dramas about

dementia I've ever seen.”

Following on Friday, June 14th, the Ellen hosts a screening of **The Last Stop in Yuma County** from director Francis Galluppi, who also wrote the film's screenplay. The film will be shown at 7:30pm.

While awaiting the next fuel truck at a middle-of-nowhere Arizona rest stop, a traveling young knife salesman is thrust into a high-stakes hostage situation by the arrival of two similarly stranded bank robbers with no qualms about using cruelty – or cold, hard steel – to protect their bloodstained, ill-begotten fortune.

Starring Francis Galluppi, Jim Cummings, Jocelin Donahue, Richard Brake, Faizon Love and Michael Abbott Jr., the film is Rated R and runs 91 min.

“Last Stop in Yuma County is the kind of movie where you root for the worst to happen, because every escalation of misfortune makes things more entertaining,” writes Matt Zoller-Seitz of *Film Week* calls *Last Stop* “A quirky, indie Neo-noir Western with a dash of Coen Brothers and a sprinkle of Tarantino. Darkly funny, well acted, and cleverly written.”

Bozeman gallery features river-based art works

Bozeman's Oxbow Gallery opens its inaugural exhibition on Saturday, June 15th, with “**Endangered Rivers**” from local artist **Ben Miller**.

Established by veteran art dealer Gary Snyder, Oxbow is a seminal space in Bozeman's emerging vibrant contemporary art community. Set within a spacious and luminous gallery, the space offers a welcoming and accessible visual arts program.

Artist Ben Miller has developed an international reputation for painting rivers with a fly rod, often in partnership with river conservation groups. The ‘Endangered Rivers’ exhibition will feature paintings from recent partnerships, including four paintings focusing on the Jefferson Basin (Big Hole, Beaverhead, Ruby and Jefferson Rivers) and a mural-size painting of the Gallatin River, painted in collaboration with the Gallatin River Task Force.

The exhibition will also include paintings of urban rivers – Miller worked in association with Friends of the Chicago River to paint the Chicago and Calumet Rivers, and with river groups in New York and New Jersey to paint the Hudson and Hackensack Rivers.

The ‘Endangered Rivers’ paintings, like the rivers themselves,

shimmer with complex layers of color and transparency. In this sense, Miller's paintings are not abstractions but a collection of moments that reflect onrushing life in constant motion. Miller's ‘Endangered Rivers’ express the idea that small parts of the world can hold our deepest attention and that by looking closely we heighten awareness of our environment.

The exhibition is curated by Gary Snyder, an art dealer known for his expertise in American art of the 1920s through the 1960s. For over thirty years, Snyder has championed historically overlooked artists. Pursuing a passion for the American West and new frontiers, Snyder moved to Montana in 2018 where he discovered Ben Miller painting the Gallatin River. This will be Snyder's third summer presenting Miller in Bozeman – the first two exhibitions were presented at Story Mill in 2020 and 2021.

The exhibition will open to the public on June 15th from noon until 5pm. There will be a gallery talk by artist Ben Miller and gallerist Gary Snyder at 2pm.

Pine Creek's summer concerts kicks into high gear

Pine Creek Lodge's summer concert series is officially underway, with the Paradise Valley venue once again set to bring a plethora of touring acts to its outdoor stage this season. Read on to see who's performing this month.

Continuing their three-night residency at the top of the month, **Kitchen Dwellers** deliver tunes from their new album, *Seven Devils*, on Saturday and Sunday, June 1st and 2nd. In *Dante's Inferno*, the author grapples with sin, its various manifestations, and its consequences. This time ultimately traces a trajectory of self-realization, acceptance and accountability. Kitchen Dwellers embark on a similar odyssey over the course of their fourth full-length offering, *Seven Devils*. The Montana quartet – Shawn Swain (mandolin), Torrin Daniels (banjo), Joe Funk (upright bass) and Max Davies (acoustic guitar) – thread together an immersive and inimitable conceptual arc inspired by *Dante's Inferno* and set to a soundtrack of folk-infused bluegrass spiked with psychedelic vision and rock energy.

Following on June 5th is Seattle-based dream pop project **Coral Grief**. Crafting surreal, playful and catchy songs, the group's sound generates reverie with intense focus, built upon a krautrock pastiche and brought to life by drummer Cam Hancock's dynamic sensibilities. Ambient guitars and weaving synths create the space for Lena Farr-Morrissey's melodies and Sam Fason's guitar work to flourish.

Colorado College Bluegrass Ensemble take the stage June 6th. The instrumental and vocal band was created to provide for students a challenging and creative environment in which to develop material with the feel and structure of bluegrass music. The ensemble draws mainly from traditional sources including Bill Monroe, Flatt and Scruggs, Jimmy Martin, and the Stanley Brothers.

On June 7th, **Keller & the Keels** are set to entertain with their brand of Appalachian psychedelic bluegrass. Of the project Williams says, "Award winning flat picker Larry Keel and his rock solid, in the pocket bass-playing wife, Jenny Keel, make up two thirds of this super fun trio I started in 2004. With three albums recorded together the handful of gigs we play a year turn into acoustic picking parties. We vowed from the beginning that we wouldn't do it often so that when we did, it would be special and it is."

Returning to Southwest Montana on June 8th are **Jerry Joseph & the Jackmormons**. Joseph is prolific and accomplished songwriter who's written hits for Widespread Panic and has released dozens of albums in his decade-spanning career as a solo artist and member of numerous groups. Flanked by the Jackmormons, the band comes to the Treasure State in support of their new album, *Mouthful of Copper*.

Casper Allen performs with support from Nathan Xander on June 9th. Detailing his

experiences in the Texas songwriting tradition of his heroes Guy Clark and Townes Van Zandt, with a raw and aggressive bluesy vocal styling reminiscent of the Texas bluesmen Freddie King and Albert Collins, Allen explores themes of addiction, life on the road and the ups and downs of a life well-traveled.

On June 12th, enjoy the stylings of **Jakob Alexander**. Paying homage to both the folk and singer/songwriter genres, with his beautifully captivating voice and acoustic guitar, Alexander performs honest covers and his own thought-provoking and heartfelt originals.

Based out of Birmingham, **Mountain Grass Unit** are set for June 13th. Playing bluegrass tunes and adding a bluegrass touch to country, jazz, funk, rock and even metal, the group has established the firm foundation to take on not only the vocal harmonies of traditional bluegrass tunes, but also the freedom to adapt songs from various genres to an all-acoustic format.

Visiting the Lodge for back-to-back shows is **STS9** on June 14th and 15th. The Atlanta-based project is known for their captivating live shows and constant touring, and have gained fans from both the jam band world and across the United States. STS9's music is described as "post-rock dance music" and mixes live rock instrumentation with electronics, favoring group rhythm over individual solos.

Tyler John Kraehling shows off his stuff June 16th. Drenched in the tradition of American troubadours, his sultry voice and crafted words tell stories that speak to the novelties and banalities of what it means to walk this earth. His clothes and guitar are second-hand, his songs anything but.

Old Crow Medicine Show perform with help from The Timber Rattlers on June 18th. The group got their start busking on street corners in the late '90s, from New York state and up through Canada, winning audiences along the way with their boundless energy and spirit. They eventually found themselves in Boone, North Carolina where they caught the attention of folk icon Doc Watson while playing in front of a pharmacy. He invited the band to play at his festival, MerleFest, and the rest is history. Their new album, *Jubilee*, released last fall.

On June 19th, **The California Honeydrops** deliver an energetic show. Formed in the subway systems of Oakland, the retro-soul outfit are an electrifying group that defy convention at every turn, navigating through a vast repertoire of original songs and timeless classics every night. But what truly sets them apart is their unwavering commitment to the art of improvisation – a skill so finely honed that they have completely abandoned the use of set lists with no two shows ever the same.

As We Become open up for the **Zoso: The Ultimate Led Zeppelin Experience** on June 20th. The group embodies Page,

Plant, Bonham and Jones in their spirit, tightly wound talent and authenticity. Their live shows are not about simply playing the right notes, they are about aura and feeling, harkening back to the unique atmosphere Led Zeppelin created.

June 21st sees the return of **Cactus Cuts** with openers Salty Gravy. The five-piece Americana folk band draws inspiration from the harmonious melodies of the Milk Carton Kids and the virtuosic guitar stylings of Doc Watson. The band weaves together intricate acoustic arrangements, compelling storytelling and lush vocal harmonies that are the perfect musical combination of modern bluegrass and old-time Americana. Their new EP, *Lies Are Sweet*, released last summer.

Melvin Seals & Jerry Garcia Band will perform June 22nd. From blues to funk to rock to jazz, Melvin Seals serves up a tasty mix with a little R&B and gospel thrown in to spice things up. Joined by JGB, the project brings an intuitive, expressive style, soul, spontaneity and remarkable chops to the table. With acoustic and electric ingredients and unique combinations of Dave Hebert's guitar and vocals, Pete Lavezzoli's hearty drums and, of course, a heapin' helpin' of the wizard's magic on Hammond B-3 Organ and keyboards. Along with backing vocals, the result is a most satisfying blend of natural organic grooves that challenges genre boundaries.

James McMurtry is back in Southwest Montana on June 23rd with opening support by Bonnie Whitmore. On his latest effort, *The Horses and the Hounds*, the acclaimed songwriter backs personal narratives with effortless elegance and endless energy. This first collection in seven years spotlights a seasoned tunesmith in peak form as he turns toward reflection and revelation. Familiar foundations guide the journey. "There's a definite Los Angeles vibe to this record," McMurtry says. "The ghost of Warren Zevon seems to be stomping around among the guitar tracks. Don't know how he got in there. He never signed on for work for hire."

Modern Grateful Dead tribute **Cosmic Charlie** transports audiences on June 26th. Rather than mimicking the Dead exactly, the band chooses to tap into the Dead's energy and style as a foundation on which to build. The result is healthy balance of creativity and tradition, where both the band and its audience are taken to that familiar edge with the sense that, music is actually being MADE

here tonight.

June 27th brings **Executive Dysfunction** to the Pine Creek stage. The Bozeman guitar duo plays acoustic original material and covers of everything from Otis Redding to Metallica.

North Fork Crossing deliver a show June 28th featuring opener WC Huntley. Their genre resides somewhere in a strange untapped musical realm between traditional bluegrass, psychedelic rock, Americana and folk. The quintet are drawn to bluegrass reaching a younger generation, priding themselves on their unique sound being the "evolution of string band music."

Abby Webster will warm up the crowd for **The Last Revel** on June 29th. A threesome of powerfully talented multi-instrumentalists, The Last Revel naturally blend the genres of folk, rockabilly, old time string-band and rock to create a sound equally original and timeless. They're known to consistently deliver "bombastic live performances," as well as delicate and haunting folk ballads. Their latest release, *Dovetail*, is available now.

Declan Banko closes out the month on June 30th. The songwriter and multi-instrumentalist from Deco & the Dusters hails from Roscommon, Ireland and the Fingerlakes region of upstate New York. Public use Challenge kicks off with trail celebration

Sponsored by the Gallatin Valley Land Trust, the kickoff to summer recreation comes on Saturday, June 1st with **National Trails Day**. GVLТ's largest trail volunteer project of the year invites trail-users and other outdoor enthusiasts to take part in the restoration of a much-loved local pathway.

This year's efforts will focus on the Highland Glen Nature Preserve. With much to be done in preparation of summer access, this single-day event will see volunteers prepping the paths with everything from trail resurfacing to weeding.

Volunteer check-in begins at 8:30am with project hours running from 9am to noon. Volunteers are asked to bring their own sunscreen, work gloves and water. Biking, walking and carpooling to the volunteer site is encouraged as there will be limited parking available at the softball complex lot. The day of hard work will be followed by a celebratory barbecue, courtesy of Yellowstone Bank.

National Trails Day also marks the start of GVLТ's annual **Summer Trails Challenge**. The seasonal community mileage

bank will be open June 1st-27th. During the challenge, the local nonprofit will receive \$1 from the Community Match Pool, donated by local businesses, for every mile that is biked, hiked, walked or run on local trails and logged online. 1 mile = \$1. It's that simple! This year's goal is 90,000 miles. Yours will help GVLТ continue to expand and enhance the Main Street to the Mountains trail system.

All participants are invited to the Challenge Finale BBQ on Friday, June 27th at the GVLТ offices. Sponsored by generous local businesses, this wonderful celebration is free and open to anyone who logs miles during the month-long Challenge.

Top 10 things to know about visiting Yellowstone

If you intend to travel to **Yellowstone National Park** this summer, plan ahead to protect yourself and this wild and awe-inspiring place. Within the park's 2.2 million acres, visitors have unparalleled opportunities to observe wildlife in an intact ecosystem, explore geothermal areas that contain half the world's active geysers and view geologic wonders like the Grand Canyon of the Yellowstone River.

Follow the top 10 things to know to enjoy your visit and protect the park for generations to come:

– **No Vehicle Reservations Required**
Vehicle reservations are not required to enter the park – just a park entrance pass. Save time at entrance stations by purchasing your pass online before you arrive. Keep in mind that summer is busy, so be prepared for crowds at popular areas and lines at the entrance stations, in construction areas and at roadside wildlife sightings. Please be patient and enjoy your visit.

– **Check Road Statuses**
Most park roads open to regular vehicles in mid-April and close to wheeled vehicles (cars, vans, motorcycles, etc.) in early November. Weather may necessitate temporary closures at any time, however, so check the park roads page for more information about current park road status

and traffic delays due to road improvement projects.

– **Plan Ahead**
All campgrounds and lodging require a reservation and are usually full well in advance of your trip. Operating hours and service levels can change with little notice. Check the latest information before coming to the park: Operating Dates, Current Conditions, Lodging and Camping, Places to Go, Things to Do, Fishing Permits as well as Boat Inspections and Permits.

– **Give Wildlife Room**
Wild animals are dangerous if you get too close! People have been injured or killed by bears, bison and elk. It's your responsibility to respect safety regulations and view wildlife from a safe distance. Always maintain a minimum of 25 yards (23m) from all wildlife and 100 yards (91m) from bears and wolves. Learn how to watch wildlife safely and travel safely in bear country.

– **Drive and Park Responsibly**
Observe posted speed limits and use pullouts to watch wildlife, take pictures and let other cars pass. Do not stop your vehicle in the road. When pulling over, be sure to park with all four tires fully to the right of the white line.

– **Stay on Boardwalks**
People have been severely injured or killed by breaking through the thin ground in ther-

mal basins or falling into hot springs.

– **Enhance Your Experience**
Download the free National Park Service app (and offline content) before you arrive in the park.

– **Expect Limited Connectivity**
Don't be surprised if you can't receive calls or texts, even in the few areas where you might have cell reception.

– **Prepare for Weather Changes**
Unpredictability characterizes Yellowstone's weather. Expect big temperature swings, rain or snow during every month of the year. No matter when you visit, bring a warm jacket, rain gear and lots of layers. Check the current weather conditions.

– **Make the Most of Your Trip**
Make it the trip of a lifetime by attending a ranger program or Indigenous cultural event, exploring the Yellowstone Tribal Heritage Center, participating in the free Junior Ranger program or checking out any of the special events happening in Yellowstone this year.

Additionally, if you really want to share your love for Yellowstone, take the Yellowstone Pledge. Encourage your friends and family to do the same and share your photos with us online using #YellowstonePledge.

Get your gloves on discounted Bridger passes

Following a sparse winter that produced limited snowfall for local skiers and snowboarders, many are already looking ahead to the bountiful slopes of the 2024-25 season. Bridger Bowl is now offering **Season Passes** at a *discounted rate through July 31st*.

Enjoy unlimited skiing all season with no black-out dates with the purchase of a season pass.

Early purchase rates are as follows: \$910 for adults (25-69), \$860 for young adults (19-24), \$505 for juniors (13-18), and \$260 for children (7-12). Pre-school aged youth (6 and under) pay only \$15. Senior passes (70-79) are \$505, or \$15 for super seniors (80+).

Adult Midweek Season Passes (19-69) are also available for \$495, or \$405 for seniors (70-79). This will grant access to unlimited skiing Monday through Friday all season. Or get your gloves on the Value Pass to ski and ride every day excluding blackout dates over busy holidays. These are \$760 for

adults (19-69), \$380 for juniors (13-18) and \$195 for children (7-12) through July 31.

Purchase season passes, upload pass photos, and sign electronic agreements through Bridger's website. Be "on-line" rather than "in-line." Go straight to the lifts on opening day! Payment plans and family discounts are available.

Log sustainable commutes for work & play for the 2024 GoGallatin Challenge

Hosted by the Gallatin Commuter Project, the 2024 **GoGallatin Challenge** will run from Monday, June 3rd to Friday, June 28th. This friendly competition between organizations and businesses in the Bozeman area challenges locals to commute to and from work by biking, walking, riding the bus, and carpooling. The annual event encourages active, sustainable and efficient means of transportation.

Bozeman Commuter Project is all about promoting active, sustainable and healthy forms of transportation to work, play, for errands and just to get outside. Biking, walking, running and rolling (skateboard, rollerblades, scooters) are all acceptable forms of transport.

As always, this is a team chal-

lenge, but individuals may still participate. Create a solo account or join a team through the event website, log your trips and win prizes. Team standings are determined by the number of trips logged by ALL enrolled team members.

What counts as a "trip"? A one-way journey to or from work, the grocery store or other utilitarian trip made by bike, bus, foot, carpool or other sustainable transportation method. If you bike both to work and home, that counts as two trips. Maximum number of trips that can be logged is 4 per day using Strava, Waze or the Commute Tracker app.

Later this month, GoGallatin and the Gallatin Valley Bicycle Club will present the **Festival of Bikes** on Friday, June 23rd at the

conclusion of the annual Challenge. The event will be held from 5-9pm in Bogert Park. The family friendly evening will allow cyclists, their friends and families an opportunity to gather and celebrate all things spokes.

The event will include suds, eats, live entertainment and a chance to visit with representatives from local bike shops. There will be contests with awesome prizes for those in attendance. Open to all, find the event hosts on social media for additional information.
