Sweet Pea fuses art & community in 47th outing

The Gallatin Valley's most eagerly anticipated summer spread of arts & culture has arrived with the return of the Sweet Pea Festival, celebrating its 47th year with its 2024 event. The weekend of events and activities will be held Friday to Sunday, August 2nd-4th in and around Lindley Park.

Sweet Pea is a three-day festival

of the arts held the first weekend in August. The Festival kicks off late Friday afternoon in Lindley Park with a performance of The Winter's Tale by Montana Shakespeare in the Parks. Saturday ramps up with a children's run and parade that lead the community to the park where the festivities continue through Sunday evening. Weekend entertainment comes in many forms – music of all genres, performances by local theatre and dance troupes, workshops, family friendly entertainment and activities, a flower show, a beer and wine garden featuring Montana libations, and countless arts and crafts vendors to stroll through and purchase unique gifts for yourself, fam-

ily and friends. The week leading up to the Festival offers additional fun-filled, community events. Artists of all skill levels converge on Main Street for 'Chalk on the Walk' Tuesday

sponsored Music on Main featuring psychedelic rock and Americana outfit North Fork Crossing on Thursday night downtown. The Sweet Pea Art Show will be on display at the ERA Landmark Downtown Visitor's Center as well.

And of course, one of the biggest draws of Sweet Pea is the live music! This year's slate will include headlining performances by alt-country artist Rayland Baxter, modern folkster John Craigie and hard-driving bluegrass quintet Po' Ramblin Boys. Also appearing will be Oliver Hazard, Left on Tenth, Ken Yates, Doc Robinson, March Fourth, Dustbowl Revival, Cole & the Thornes and Alysha

Events leading up to Festival weekend are complimentary. Entry to those in Lindley Park requires the purchase of an admission wristband - Full Weekend Access wristbands are \$40 and free for kids 12 and under. Weekend passes will be \$60 beginning Aug. 2nd, or \$40 per day. These may be found at the main box office - located in front of the Bozeman Library.


Artisanal Food

Grillmasters unite for BBQ showcase



After recently touring with Robert Plant and Zac Brown Band (2 years with each), producing albums for Malcolm Holcombe and Guy Clark and being named 'songwriter of the year" for both ASCAP and NSAI, these days find him roaming his Tennessee wilderness acreage hiking along the small river, creating delicious meals with food raised on his property, and playing music. He often leads songwriting workshops to help people tell their own truths with their stories, and is as busy as always writing, producing, performing, and just plain fully immersing himself in life.



Custer Gallatin celebrates Smokey Bear's 80th birthday

From Custer Gallatin National Forest Custer Gallatin National Forest is excited to announce that the forest will be hosting the Rudolph Wendelin Smokey Bear Artwork Tour August 12th-23rd in celebration of Smokey Bear's 80th birthday. This nation-wide tour features replicas of the iconic artwork of Smokey's most famous artist, Rudolph "Rudy" Wendelin. Artwork will be on display at both Earthquake Lake Visitor Center and the West Yellowstone Visitor Information Center. There will be special programs focused on fire safety and wildfire prevention and appearances by Smokey Bear himself.

In connection with this special tour and in honor of the 65th anniversary of the 1959 Hebgen Lake earthquake, Earthquake Lake Visitor Center will also have on display three original watercolors of the Earthquake Lake area by Rudy Wendelin. These watercolors were completed in the 1970s when Wendelin traveled west to capture iconic US Forest Service locations using his artistic talents.

Smokey Bear was introduced in 1944 as an advertising icon of the U.S. Forest Service's Wildfire Prevention Campaign. This campaign aimed to reduce wildfires since many men were serving in the armed forces during World War II, reducing the number of individuals available at home to fight wildfires. Rudy Wendelin first started working for the US Forest Service as an illustrator in 1933 and took over as the campaign's full-time artist in 1949.

Thanks to Wendelin's iconic art, Smokey's message, "Only YOU can prevent wildfires," has prevailed

through the generations.

The West Yellowstone Visitor Information Center will host Smokey Bear's birthday celebration on Friday, August 9th from 4–6pm ahead of the art exhibit. Smokey will be in attendance and cake will be served.
