

#### Doc Series profiles friendship in pre-war Gaza

On Thursday, February 6th, the Bozeman Doc Series continues with the Montana premiere of the awardwinning new documentary, *Yalla Parkour*. The film screens at 7pm.

Filmmaker Areeb Zuaiter was born in the mountainous city of Nablus, Palestine. Her parents found opportunities outside of Palestine and left when she was still an infant. Still, they visited every year. With those visits, she would watch her mother transform into what she'd call "her true self," and her smile would come back to life. Folded in those visits, is one visit to Gaza. She was only four. It was her first encounter with the sea. The memory of her mother's genuine smile by the seaside left a lasting impression on her.

Recently, nostalgia for her homeland resurfaces when she discovers a video of young men practicing parkour on Gaza's sandy shores. Their joy starkly contrasts with distant explosions. Longing to reconnect with her past, Areeb reaches out to the parkour team and bonds with an athlete named Ahmed. Together, they navigate the remnants of Gaza, exploring places like a cemetery, a run-down mall and the remains of an airport.

As their relationship deepens, Ahmed reveals the harsh realities of life in Gaza, transforming Areeb's initial curiosity into a profound awareness of his struggles. Areeb grapples with guilt and conflict as she witnesses Ahmed's desire to escape the confines of his homeland, understanding the emotional void such a departure would entail. Their journey becomes a quest to reclaim memories and explore identity, belonging, and the haunting legacy of a home left behind. *Yalla Parkour* offers a last glimpse of a pre-October 7th Gaza.

### PK Night(s) highlight late local climber & more

At his death in October 1999, Alex Lowe was hailed by many as the best climber in the world. The climbing legend put up new routes in the ice features of Hyalite Canyon and the tallest peaks in the world, but it was his infectious spirit that drew others to him on his daring adventures.

In 2003-2004, Terry Cunningham, current Bozeman mayor, spearheaded the arduous and ultimately successful effort to have a peak south of Bozeman and west of Mount Blackmore named in honor of Alex.

Terry is one of ten presenters at the next **PechaKucha Night(s)**. The events will be held at Downtown Bozeman's Ellen Theatre on Wednesday and Thursday, February 19th and 20th. Both shows begin at 6:40pm and feature the same lineup of speakers both nights.

One-hundred-year-old rocket scientist, Congressional Gold Medal Winner and docent at the Museum of the Rockies for 34 years, Maury Irvine will present on his travels with famed dinosaur expert Jack Horner. A veteran PK presenter, Maury will describe his experiences with Jack in Mongolia, Romania, Kenya, Patagonia and Egg Mountain in Montana

Dave Carlson will regale us with stories of the ups and downs he and his wife experienced over the past seven years in their search for innovative ways to keep their heat pumps working, their electric snowblower and car charged and their food cookec

Trying to make a living in a challenging environment is nothing new to our local beaver population. Gennifre Hartman, head of school at Headwaters Academy, asks us to reconsider another part of our lives – how we travel. Rather than focus on Instagram-worthy moments, she calls for us to embrace unscripted moments, build community and foster genuine connection.

Ken Sinay, an interpretive guide in the Greater Yellowstone ecosystem for more than 30 years, gives us an inside look at the intimate connection to the landscape possessed by William Clark and Sacagawea and lacking in most travelers today.

### Locals front production of Tracy Letts award winner

In *The Minutes*, Tracy Letts's scathing dark comedy about smalltown politics and real-world power, the playwright who penned *August: Osage County* exposes the ugliness behind some of our most closelyheld American narratives while asking each of us what we would do to keep from becoming history's losers. The local stage production will be presented February 13th–23rd at Bozeman Event Space. Thursday, Friday and Saturday performances begin at 7:30pm, with Sunday shows at 5pm.

Set in a small town city council meeting, *The Minutes* is part comedy, part mystery, part drama, and playwright Letts tackles the central Native American theme as a critique of the historical whitewashing of indigenous populations in the United States. The plot centers around the troubles that arise when a new member starts to ask some uncomfortable questions, like: Why is one member gone and not to be spoken of, and why are the previous meeting's minutes nowhere to be found? Letts's story has managed to

invite comparisons to *Parks & Recreation* and Rod Serling's *Twilight Zone* with a little bit of Alfred Hitchcock thrown in.

"The impulse of the town hall meeting was, of course, to take something very small and specific and hope that it represents a larger idea," Letts said. "For me, The Minutes was a way to look at how we write and pass along our history. The way we function with it, the way we move forward through a day, through our lives, knowing what we know about our history, knowing the things that we have learned or unlearned or learned wrong about who we are and how we got here. Every time we throw out food or the casual ways in which we live with great comfort and take that for granted. I wanted to explore that."

The Minutes premiered in 2017 at Chicago's Steppenwolf Theater and was nominated for the Pulitzer Prize for Drama in 2018. The play went on to a successful Broadway run in 2022, earning nominations for the Tony and Outer Critics Circle Awards for Best Play.

Chicago Sun-Times called The Minutes, "Astonishing... a pitch-black comedy about the current state of American politics," and the Chicago Tribune hailed the play as, "Explosive... Deftly captures the tension of patriotic grandiosity and provincial defensiveness found in city

halls across the land." The Minutes features an all-star Bozeman cast, including John Hosking, Rhonda Smith and Tom Morris, all original Montana Shakespeare in the Parks alums and founders of Bozeman's Vigilante Players. Other actors well-known to area theater-goers include Eli Bovd. Jenna Ciralli, Will Dickerson, Daniel Erickson, Alex Miller, Colton Swibold, Phil Taylor and Cara Wilder. The Minutes is directed by Montana native, MSU alum, and world-renowned magician, John Lovick (aka "Handsome Jack").

## Enter high society London with Shane spectacle

Local thespians return to the Livingston stage with a trip to 1912 London this month. The Shane Lalani Center for the Arts presents a production of Lerner and Loewe's *My Fair Lady* from February 28th through March 23rd.

Hailed by critics and audiences for its heart and its wit, My Fair Lady is a beautiful musical about transformation, patronage, gender politics and class, based on George Bernard Shaw's play, Pygmalion.

Acclaimed Professor and confirmed bachelor Henry Higgins makes a wager with his linguistic colleague Colonel Pickering that in six months he can pass off "gutter snipe" Eliza Doolittle as a duchess at an embassy ball. Through arduous training, day and night, Eliza learns how to speak English "properly,"

and transforms into a lady respected and adored by all classes. Along the way she bewitches young Freddy Einsford-Hill into falling in love with her, and convinces a supposed linguistics expert that she is royalty.

Through her transformation process, Eliza forges a deep connection with Colonel Pickering and most especially with Professor Higgins. However, she finds herself in a difficult position, now too refined to go back to her old life and not with any means or desire to live life as a lady of leisure – especially by herself

When Higgins completely fails to acknowledge Eliza's role in her own transformation, she leaves his home. It is only then that Higgins realizes that he cares deeply for Eliza. The musical ends with Eliza's return to

Higgins' home, and the ending is left ambiguous, yet it is beloved for being both one of the cleverest and one of the most romantic shows of all time [Stage Agent].

#### Last Best delivers night of volcanic comedy

Scientist turned stand-up comedian Ben Miller fronts new comedy tour "Stand-Up Science Presents: Volcano" with a Bozeman performance this month. Last Best Comedy will host the comic on Wednesday, February 26th. The show begins at 7pm.

What happens when a comedian walks into a volcano? In February 2023, Ben Miller was the artist in residence at Hawai'i Volcanoes National Park, the first stand-up comedian ever selected. The program typically selects painters, poets, Grammy-nominated musicians, you know, real artists. But somehow a silly joke boy managed to secure this coveted spot.

He spent the entire month on the Big Island, exploring the national park, learning from volcanologists, entomologists, archeologists and local Hawaiians about the science, culture and history of Hawai'i. Almost every night, he gazed into the fires of K lauea, the burning lava lake in Halema uma u crater and also wrote some jokes. Incredibly grateful for the opportunity provided to him by the National Parks Arts Foundation, Miller decided to take this comedic residency very seriously and turn it into an hour of stand-up comedy.

Building off his experience with

his previous science comedy hour that had a 50-city tour across the US and Europe as well as a completely sold out 23-show run at the 2022 Edinburgh Fringe Festival, 'Stand-Up Science Presents: Volcano' continues to develop Miller's nerdy yet approachable style. This multimedia science comedy hour drills deep to the core, delivering explosive laughs with fire-tested jokes.

#### **Armory Music Hall to host infectious** indie rock show

Bozeman's Armory Music Hall welcomes indie folk rock band The Takes to its modern space this month. The California-based group's tour comes to the Gallatin Valley in support of their latest release, Lay Hold. The 18+ show is set for Thursday, February 20th, with opening support from Colourblind. Presented in cooperation with Deco Music Group, the music begins at 7:30pm.

In 2020, Sumner Rahr (guitar/vocals) and Fritz Frerichs (drums) found themselves in lackson, Wyoming, writing songs together in their living room to pass the time. The result was the High Lonesome EP. The band's first release as a two-piece rock band that skewed psychedelic, taking inspiration from Pink Floyd and

When asked to play their first live set at a friend's warehouse, the pair recruited high school friend

Phoebe Webb (bass) and Sumner's brother Guido Rahr (guitar) for a show that made the group want to stick together. Between semesters away at school, the four friends spent their summer and winter breaks playing shows and recording new music, culminating in a move to Berkeley, California. They built a studio and rehearsal space from scratch out of their Berkeley garage and began working on music together, finally in the same place.

On their 2024 EP Lay Hold, The Takes delve further into their country/blues rock tendencies, led by Sumner's raw lead vocal and backdropped by a classic four-piece arrangement of guitar, drums and bass. Drawing from their early psychedelic influences, the band still creates songs the way a jam band would. "Someone comes up with a riff, we'll start out writing it one way, and as time goes on we'll change it and change it," Sumner

explains. "We'll mess around until a song slowly gets shaped out of it." Similar to the band's formation, their lyrical themes are organic: the changing of the leaves, flickering lights, relationships that drift apart.

The band's unbound approach is part of their ethos. Shaped by the Pacific Northwest and its innate rock traditions, The Takes feel most at home in the outdoors, forging songs to soundtrack scenic road trips or nights spent around campfires. "I think our community is less placebased and more so with people who resonate with our same values,' Phoebe says. "Just spending time outside, whether it's Portland or Jackson or Berkeley."
