
siblings.

Shane teens presents some ‘Greased Lightning’

It’s a leather jacket affair at Livingston’s Shane Lalani Center for the Arts as their community theatre season continues. Dress accordingly for *Grease: The Musical* with performances running from May 2nd through May 18th. A teen theater production.
It’s 1959, and Rydell High School’s senior class is in rare form. The too-cool-for-school “Burger Palace Boys” are stealing hub-caps and acting tough and their gum-snapping, chain-smoking “Pink Ladies” are looking hot in bobby sox and pedal pushers. The 1950s high school dream is about to explode in this rollicking musical that is both an homage to the idealism of the fifties and a satire of high schoolers’ age-old desire to be rebellious, provocative and rebellious.
At the heart of the story is the romance between hot-rod-ding gangster Danny Zuko and the sweet new girl in town, Sandy



Dumbrowski. They had a secret romance in summer, but now back in the context of school, peer-pressure and cliques make their love a bit more complicated. Can Danny maintain his cool dude status and still get make demure Sandy his girl?
The whole gang sings and dances around Danny and Sandy’s romance, through such hit songs as “Greased Lightning”, “We Go Together” and “Mooning,” recall-

ing the music of Buddy Holly, Little Richard and Elvis Presley that became the soundtrack of a generation. Starting off with an eight-year Broadway run, *Grease* is among the world’s most popular musicals and has a cult-like following, especially among teens [*Stage Agent*].





BFS titles explore defiant living, Nigerian mythology

Bozeman Film Society continues its latest season with documentary *Secret Mall Apartment* on Wednesday, May 14th. The event will be held at Downtown Bozeman’s Ellen Theatre at 7:30pm.

In one of the most unique stories to come out of a mall, the film follows the story of 8 young Rhode Island artists who secretly built a fully functioning apartment inside one of the country’s busiest mall as a political-motivated prank – and ended up living there 4 years, filming everything along the way.

Far more than just a wild prank, the secret mall apartment became an incredibly meaningful act for all the participants, at once an act of defiance against local gentrification,

a boundary-pushing work of public/private art, and a 750 square foot space that sticks it to the man. Jerry Workman directs alongside executive producer Jesse Eisenberg. Rated PG-13, the film runs 91 minutes.

“Deliciously entertaining!” – *Vulture*

Following on Wednesday, May 28th, catch an Ellen screening of Montana screenwriter and director Nnamdi Kanaga’s *Water Girl*. The film screens at 7:30pm.

The film is a supernatural drama based on the “ gbanje” mythology, and pays homage to the truthfulness of old Nollywood storytelling while exploring new horizons of modern-day cinema. The joys of motherhood are overshadowed

by agony when Nkechi discovers that her daughter, Kamsi, is bound to the cyclical existence of the gbanje – a spirit child trapped in the maze of life, death and rebirth.





Katie Hall kicks off the month on May 1st. She performs country and folk music featuring acoustic
