MOR to open new paleontology exhibit

For the first time in over ten years, Museum of the Rockies unveils a new primary paleontology exhibition this month. Following its members-only preview, **Cretaceous Crossroads** opens to the public on Wednesday, July 2nd.

On Earth, it is generally true that where there is water, there is life. This was certainly the case with the Western Interior Sea during the Late Cretaceous. This large seaway, which bisected North America, was not only teeming with marine life; it also cultivated a rich habitat for plants and animals along its shores. As mosasaurs and other aquatic reptiles hunted beneath the waves, tyrannosaurs ascended to the top of the food chain on land, where they remained until the end of the Cretaceous, when the age of the dinosaurs drew to a close.

Cretaceous Crossroads will explore this time of transition, with a focus on three geologic formations in Montana (Two Medicine, Judith River and Bearpaw) that span the period from 72 to 82 million years ago. The exhibit is comprised of real fossil material, 3D prints, casting, reproductions, murals, new paleo-art, AV interactives, an augmented reality piece, microscope stations, discovery drawers and more.

Visitors will see a mounted *Maiasaura* (Montana's State Fossil) tending to its nest, a 30-foot-long *Daspletosaurus horneri* (large meat-eating dinosaur, cousin to T. rex, dinosaur eggs and clutches, *Troodon* (small raptor-like dinosaurs), a 23-

foot-long *Mosasaurus*, and many other specimens, some of which are only known from Montana. This includes never-before-seen specimens that are not just new to Museum of the Rockies; they are new to science!

Also take in MOR's latest changing exhibit ***SUE: The T.rex Experience***. Step into the world of SUE the T. rex to uncover the mysteries about the life of this fearsome fossil.

Come between two titans with full-scale casts of SUE and T. rex's nemesis, Triceratops. Experience a unique multimedia show transporting you to the Cretaceous forest alongside SUE. Learn how the fossil was unearthed, and how scientists continue to make discoveries about SUE, the most complete *Tyrannosaurus rex* specimen ever discovered.

Use all of your senses to take in SUE's world. Take a whiff of their putrid breath, watch SUE tromp through the Late Cretaceous forest, feel the texture of dinosaur skin, and hear the subsonic rumble of a T. rex. See the fossils of animals, plants and dinosaurs that lived during the Late Cretaceous period, and come face-to-face with a full-size, fleshed-out replication of a ferocious T. rex battling the duck-billed herbivore, *Edmontosaurus*.

Broadway title marks 30 years of Ellen musicals

Downtown Bozeman's Ellen Theatre invites audiences to return for Montana TheatreWorks' latest production, Joe Masteroff's ***Cabaret***. Performances will begin July 10th and run through July 27th. Tickets are on sale now.

Set in 1930 at Berlin's colorful Kit Kat Klub during the twilight of the Jazz Age, with a story revolving around American writer Cliff Bradshaw and nightclub performer Sally Bowles, this powerhouse musical features the hit songs "Money," "Maybe This Time," "Tomorrow Belongs to Me," "Two Ladies" and the show-stopping title tune "Cabaret."

Sally Bowles, considered one of the most challenging female characters ever created, was immortalized on film in 1972 by Liza Minnelli, winning her the Academy Award for Best Actress. Other notable performers who have tackled the highly sought after role include Emma Stone, Natasha Richardson, Julie Harris, Michelle Williams and even Judy Dench.

Originally opening on Broadway in 1966, *Cabaret* won eight Tony Awards, including Best Musical, and ran for an astounding 1,166 performances. Subsequent New York productions added seven more Tony Awards, including two for Best Revival in 1998 and 2024, catapulting *Cabaret* into the echelons of Musical Theatre Royalty.

In addition to Sally's plotline, a tumultuous Germany slowly yields to a changing political climate and we

witness the fated romance of boarding house owner Fräulein Schneider and a kindly fruit vendor named Herr Schultz. Meanwhile, overseeing the music, drama and laughter is the Kit Kat's Master of Ceremonies, while the club itself serves as a metaphor, reflecting the various attitudes of the locals and expatriates.

It was July 1995 when Montana TheatreWorks presented its first summer musical to packed audiences at Willson Auditorium. Now, thirty years later, over 177,000 have attended their local productions. With *Cabaret*, performers from New York will once again join the cast for this timely story with exhilarating songs and dances, maintaining the company's goal of exceptional musical theatre.

Joe Masteroff's *Cabaret* is presented by Montana TheatreWorks, producers of *Mary Poppins*, *The Sound of Music*, *Annie*, *Oklahoma!*, *Damn Yankees*, *Guys and Dolls*, *Fiddler on the Roof* and more.

Numerous performances of *Cabaret* will be held July 10th–27th with evening shows and Sunday matinees. Tickets to this summer production begin at \$34 with premium seating available. This production is recommended for adult audiences.

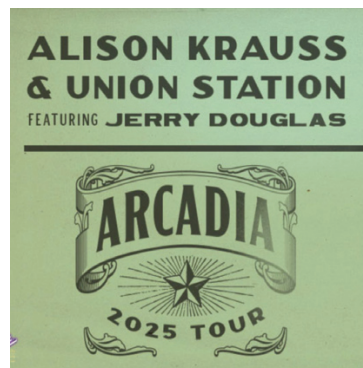
