MOR to open new paleontology exhibit

For the first time in over ten years, Museum of the Rockies unveils a new primary paleontology exhibition this month. Following its members-only preview, *Cretaceous Crossroads* opens to the public on Wednesday, July 2nd.

On Earth, it is generally true that where there is water, there is life. This was certainly the case with the Western Interior Sea during the Late Cretaceous. This large seaway, which bisected North America, was not only teeming with marine life; it also cultivated a rich habitat for plants and animals along its shores. As mosasaurs and other aquatic reptiles hunted beneath the waves, tyrannosaurs ascended to the top of the food chain on land, where they remained until the end of the Cretaceous, when the age of the dinosaurs drew to a close.

Cretaceous Crossroads will explore this time of transition, with a focus on three geologic formations in Montana (Two Medicine, Judith River and Bearpaw) that span the period from 72 to 82 million years ago. The exhibit is comprised of real fossil material, 3D prints, casting, reproductions, murals, new paleo-art, AV interactives, an augmented reality piece, microscope stations, discovery drawers and more.

Visitors will see a mounted Maiasaura (Montana's State Fossil) tending to its nest, a 30-foot-long Daspletosaurus horneri (large meateating dinosaur, cousin to T. rex, dinosaur eggs and clutches, Troodon (small raptor-like dinosaurs), a 23foot-long Mosasaurus, and many other specimens, some of which are only known from Montana. This includes never-before-seen specimens that are not just new to Museum of the Rockies; they are new to science!

Also take in MOR's latest changing exhibit *SUE: The T.rex Experience*. Step into the world of SUE the T. rex to uncover the mysteries about the life of this fearsome fossil.

Come between two titans with full-scale casts of SUE and T. rex's nemesis, Triceratops. Experience a unique multimedia show transporting you to the Cretaceous forest alongside SUE. Learn how the fossil was unearthed, and how scientists continue to make discoveries about SUE, the most complete Tyrannosaurus rex specimen ever discovered.

Use all of your senses to take in SUE's world. Take a whiff of their putrid breath, watch SUE tromp through the Late Cretaceous forest, feel the texture of dinosaur skin, and hear the subsonic rumble of a T. rex. See the fossils of animals, plants and dinosaurs that lived during the Late Cretaceous period, and come face-to-face with a full-size, fleshedout replication of a ferocious T. rex battling the duck-billed herbivore, Edmontosaurus.

Broadway title marks 30 years of Ellen musicals

Downtown Bozeman's Ellen Theatre invites audiences to return for Montana TheatreWorks' latest production, Joe Masteroff's **Cabaret**. Performances will begin July 10th and run through July 27th. Tickets are on sale now.

Set in 1930 at Berlin's colorful Kit Kat Klub during the twilight of the Jazz Age, with a story revolving around American writer Cliff Bradshaw and nightclub performer Sally Bowles, this powerhouse musical features the hit songs "Money," "Maybe This Time," "Tomorrow Belongs to Me," "Two Ladies" and the show-stopping title tune "Cabaret."

Sally Bowles, considered one of the most challenging female characters ever created, was immortalized on film in 1972 by Liza Minnelli, winning her the Academy Award for Best Actress. Other notable performers who have tackled the highly sought after role include Emma Stone, Natasha Richardson, Julie Harris, Michelle Williams and even Judy Dench.

Originally opening on Broadway in 1966, *Cabaret* won eight Tony witness the fated romance of boarding house owner Fräulein Schneider and a kindly fruit vendor named Herr Schultz. Meanwhile, overseeing the music, drama and laughter is the Kit Kat's Master of Ceremonies, while the club itself serves as a metaphor, reflecting the various attitudes of the locals and expatriates.

It was July 1995 when Montana TheatreWorks presented its first summer musical to packed audiences at Willson Auditorium. Now, thirty years later, over 177,000 have attended their local productions. 

Cool off with Eagles sips & sound

The dog days of summer have arrived and Downtown Bozeman's Eagles Bar is ready to serve it up cold every night of the week. The local tavern is also home to a steady schedule of Wednesday acoustics and weekend jamming. Here's who's performing in the coming weeks.

Next up is **Jukebox Hero** on July 4th and 5th. Fronted by Harley Osterlund, the acousticbased arrangement features a number of originals and crowd favorites. The Colorado musician tours relentlessly, whose life of music began at an early age, having since worked with some of the biggest names in blues, 80s rock n' roll and country music.

Check out **The Dirty Dirty** on July 11th and 12th. The local

Luke Flansburg fronts a solo show on July 16th. He'll bring a wide variety of music ranging from funk to rock to blues. Also a member of Pinky & the Floyd, Tsunami Funk and MOTH, prepare for a fun set of covers and originals that will span the genres.

The Love Darts perform on July 18th and 19th. The hard rock punk band got its start playing venues like the Haufbrau, having since grown into a fine-tuned project featuring some of Bozeman's most energetic gui-



tarists. Take a listen to their selfprofessed "sloppy rock n' roll" on their EP, *Girly*.

Take in the acoustic stylings of local favorite **Mathias** on July 23rd. With powerful vocals and a percussive guitar style, he's known for his dynamic live performances full of acoustic folk, rock, and funk tunes.

Billings-based **FlavaTown** will bring down the house on July 25th and 26th. The multi-piece is known for their brand of flavorful old school soul, R&B and funk pop grooves. The band features Scott Morales, Alex Nauman, Erik Olsen, Gabe Bonvicino and Isaiah Morales.

Closing out the month on July 30th, **Greg Hall** provides the live acoustics. Member of local band Dilly Dilly, expect stripped-down renditions of their rockin' material as well as solo cuts. Head downtown for your midweek cold one and enjoy his musical stylings!

Exercise your pipes with the voted 'Best' **Karaoke Night** in town, sponsored by Bozeman's Best Entertainment Group, setting up at FOE every Thursday. Sing your heart out and cheer on your friends! Sign-ups start at 9pm.

Make sure to check out **Bridger Mountain Big Band** on Sunday nights. The ensemble performs at 7pm. The 17-piece jazz orchestra celebrates the music of Duke Ellington, Count Basie and more, with original arrangements




