Arts, culture & community merge in Lindley

Art and community meet as the **Sweet Pea Festival** returns to the Bozeman area for its 2025 event, Friday to Sunday, August 1st–3rd in celebration of its 48th year.

Sweet Pea is a three-day festival of the arts held the first weekend in August. The Festival kicks off late Friday afternoon in Lindley Park, ramping up on Saturday with a children's run and parade that lead the community to the park where the festivities continue through Sunday evening. Weekend entertainment comes in many forms – music of all genres, performances by local theatre and dance troupes, workshops, family friendly entertainment and activities, a flower show, a beer and wine garden featuring Montana microbrews, and countless arts and crafts vendors to stroll through and purchase unique gifts for yourself, family and friends.

The week leading up to the Festival offers additional fun-filled, community events. Artists of all skill levels converge on Main Street for 'Chalk on the Walk' Tuesday morning, followed by a Sweet Pea-sponsored Music on Main on Thursday night downtown. The Sweet Pea Art Show will be on display at the Bozeman Public Library as well.

And of course, one of the biggest draws of Sweet Pea is the live music! This year's slate will include headlining performances by Brent Cobb, The White Buffalo, The Hip Abduction and TopHouse. Also

appearing will be Fruition, Goldie Boutlier, The Fretliners, Wild Horses, Benn Busalacchi, North Fork Crossing and The Wildwoods.

Events leading up to Festival weekend are complimentary. Entry to those in Lindley Park requires the purchase of an admission wristband – Full Weekend Access wristbands are \$60, or \$40 per day, and free for kids 12 and under. These may be found at the box office, located in front of the Bozeman Public Library.

Since 1977, Sweet Pea has brought Bozeman together through music, dance, visual arts, and community celebration. Inspired by the early 1900s Sweet Pea Carnivals, a group of local visionaries launched the festival to spotlight the arts and spark creative connection.

Now one of Montana's premier arts festivals, Sweet Pea draws thousands annually and operates as a nonprofit powered by volunteers. Since 1986, all proceeds beyond festival costs are reinvested into the Bozeman community – supporting arts, education, and cultural programming.

Today, Sweet Pea is a beloved Bozeman tradition – still celebrating art, still volunteer-run, and still giving back. •

In addition to the world class music lineup, the stage at SLAM will showcase alternate performances of dance, spin & yoga demonstrations and more.

Bozeman's Museum of the Rockies has announced an exciting new summer series to be held every Tuesday in August. **"History on Tap"** moves into the Living History Farm for this weekly series where folk music, engaging history conversations and brews come together.

Free of admission, the series is open to all ages on a first come, first in basis. Local eats and beverages available for purchase from featured breweries and food trucks from 5:30–7:30pm including:

Enjoy live American roots music with Prairie Schooners, as well as an open mic. Musicians are encouraged to bring their instruments and share their musical talents with the crowd. A unique history chat each week will also connect with the past in an informal, engaging way. Bring your chairs, blankets, non-alcoholic beverages and a picnic dinner (outside alcohol prohibited). A food truck may be available, but it is not guaranteed. The cash bar will offer a rotating selection of local brews for purchase. Last call is at 7:30pm, and the Living History Farm gates will close at 8pm. There are no tickets or reservations, so arrive early, find a spot and enjoy an evening of history, music and community.

Also at MOR, the **Living History Farm** invites museum-goers to experience what life was like in the Treasure State more than 100 years ago during regular hours of operation.

In 1989, the Tinsley House was relocated to Museum, bringing with it the history of Montana's home-steading era. Skilled costumed interpreters will take you back in time as they cook over a wood-burning stove, demonstrate cooking skills and recipes from the 1890s, tend to the Heirloom Garden, and forge iron in the blacksmith's shop. Take time this summer to enjoy the beautiful sights of the garden, the smells of home cooking, and the history of a time gone by that lives on today.

The Living History Farm is included with Museum admission. Hours are 11am–5pm with its seasonal closing set for Sept. 1st. Find additional information through the MOR website.

World music concert promotes love and harmony

The Shane Lalani Center for the Arts is set to host *One Love Livingston*, an extraordinary evening of world music this month. This rare, one-night-only event is fronted by **Mighty Mystic & the Hard Roots Movement** as part of their “Walk Tall” summer tour celebrating the release of their new album. The event will take place on Saturday, August 30th, beginning at 7pm.

A world music concert promoting harmony, the event seeks to promote understanding and celebrate cultural diversity through

music. Originally from Jamaica, Mighty Mystic is one of the most exciting reggae artists performing today, with an authentic sound that honors the music’s origins, while adding a hard rock feel with impressive lead guitars, hard-hitting lyrics and deep bass lines. Internationally known for his skill and genre blending, this is a one time opportunity not to be missed.

Also performing, **Sean Devine & the Stars of Anguila**. The local singer/songwriter traveled to Anguilla in winter 2023, where he met legendary musician Bankie

Banx. This encounter led to the creation of his new EP, *Die Happy*, recorded at Anguilla Music Academy with Bankie’s band. The album features a blend of Montana songwriting and Caribbean rhythms, highlighted by the uplifting single “Grow Up Beautiful” and the title track featuring Jamaican artist Mighty Mystic. Talented musicians Dennis Warrington and Jaiden Fleming, from the recording band, will be joining Devine for this performance.

One Love Livingston will also feature local artist Shadow Devereaux, known by his stage name of **Foreshadow**. He is a Salish and Blackfeet hip-hop artist, audio engineer and advocate for Indigenous youth from the Flathead Indian Reservation. With over a decade of experience, he fuses cultural roots with modern hip-hop to uplift and inspire, blending themes of resilience, struggle and pride. He won a Native American Music Award in 2022 for “Protect Your People” and contributed a powerful song to the 2024 documentary *Bring Them Home*, narrated by Lily Gladstone. In 2025, he released his debut solo album, *Perfect Timing*, a bold and introspective body of work marking a major milestone in his career. Beyond the music, Shadow works alongside collaborator Colter Olmstead to teach film and music to youth on and off the reservation. As Foreshadow, he continues to use his platform to empower his community and amplify Indigenous voices through storytelling and sound.

Rockin' bluegrass blows the doors off Brick

Celebrated bluegrass artist **Billy Strings** brings a show to Brick Breeden Fieldhouse this month. He visits Bozeman as part of his "Summer 25" tour on Friday, August 15th. The music is set to begin at 7:30pm.

Strings has quickly gained attention for his incendiary live performances and imbuing his take on Americana with distinctive bursts of psychedelic virtuosity. While deeply reverent of the roots of traditional bluegrass music, which his father shared with him as a boy, Strings learned his high-energy performing skills by playing fleet-fingered guitar solos in a heavy metal band in his native Michigan. While he has matured as a player, singer and songwriter in his own right, and re-embraced the music his father introduced him to, Strings has applied the intensity of heavy metal to bluegrass.

Bridging Nashville and the Great West, Kentucky and mid-60s northern California, tie-dye and plaid, it's a world of his own, and wide world of musical adventure at that. Plurb and Street Milk open for **STiLGONE** on Aug. 9th.

The band plays a unique fusion of genres, spanning funk, soul, hip-hop, reggae, psychedelic rock and more. While covering so many styles they manage to create a cohesive sound that is uniquely their own, one they have dubbed "intergalactic dirtbag soul." Their live shows are an immersive trip through detailed soundscapes, danceable grooves and the lyrics of songwriter and guitarist Symon Palmer. Their new album, *B.O.L.O.*, is available now.

Aug. 10th sees a performance by industry veterans **G. Love & Special Sauce**.

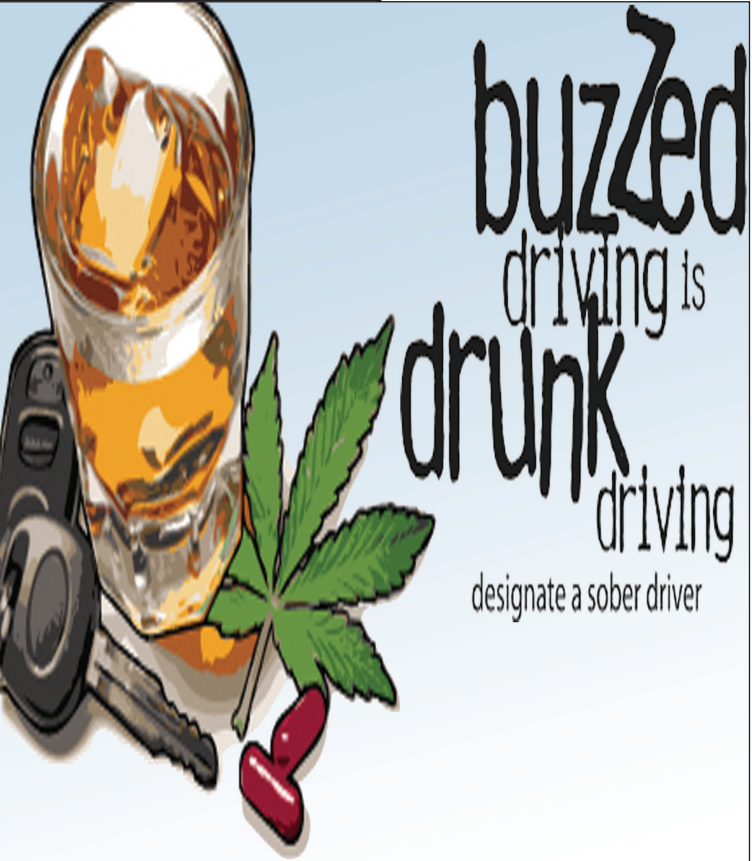

Doc screening explores wolf-human relationship

Wolf Haven International will present documentary *The Trouble with Wolves* on Friday, August 8th, at the Emerson Center for the Arts & Culture. The film screens at 7pm.

The film is an exploration of the complex and often controversial relationship between wolves and humans in the American West. The documentary delves into the challenges and rewards surrounding wolf reintroduction and conservation efforts, highlighting differing viewpoints from livestock producers, conservationists and wildlife managers. This screening is the 2023 edition, featuring updates from the initial film release in 2018.

Wolf Haven International is an internationally recognized wolf sanctuary that has rescued and provided a lifetime home for over 300 displaced, captive-born animals

since 1982 under the mission “to conserve and protect wolves and their habitat.” Wolf Haven is accredited by both the Global Federation of Animal Sanctuaries and the American Sanctuary Association. Wolf Haven is located in Tenino, Washington – approximately 12 miles south of the state capital in Olympia.

Following the film there will be a brief Powerpoint presentation about Wolf Haven and its mission, followed by a Q&A session.
