Fringe Fest returns with 2nd outing

After its successful debut last season, the **Livingston Fringe Festival** returns September 2nd–6th and 10th–13th. Events will be held at numerous downtown venues. Fringe theatre festivals have their roots in the Edinburgh Fringe Fest in Scotland, established in 1947, where the city comes alive with the performing arts.

The Livingston fest showcases the abilities of local theater artists, as well as giving venues and audiences a meaningful opportunity to participate in the arts. Last year produced twelve plays in nine locations over six days, with thirty-four performers, and saw nearly 800 audience members attend. This year the festival looks to expand over two weeks, and has accepted fifteen plays.

Festival directors Kate Britton and Tessa Welsch are eager to share this year’s productions, “The caliber of artists is exciting this year!” Britton remarks “There is also quite a lot of diversity in the work being produced.

Something for everyone.” Welsch agrees, “We have productions from a broad range of genres. It was difficult to narrow down the submissions”

Twenty-five artists submitted their work early this spring, and Welsch and Britton selected fifteen from that list. Artists selected to be a part of Livingston Fringe Festival have been supported over a five-month period to create an original piece of theater. They are offered structure, feedback, technical support and a platform to share their work.

This year’s artists include: Marla Goodman, Michael Mason, Danae Bray, Stephanie Burda, Kyrie Dawson, Kelly Bouma, Marc Beaudin, Chace McNinch, Jeff Medley, Tyler Potter, Cora Roseberry, John Roseberry, Sister Act, The Sleepless Elite and Gus Yeager. Audiences can expect everything from movement pieces to comedy, music, film screenplays, dramatic pieces, experimental theatre, improv

and everything in between.

Once again, the performances will take place at multiple venues around Livingston including the Blue Slipper Theatre, The Empire, The Shane Lalani Center for the Arts, Wheatgrass Books, the Old Lumberyard and Elk River Books, among others.

“This festival was created to give a platform to innovative theatre makers in our area,” Britton explains “Partnering with so many local organizations show the community’s involvement and support. We are grateful!” Welsch states, “The energy in this festival is lively, the whole town really shows up and comes together. We hope you can join us!”

Bull riding doc screens alongside film’s star

The Livingston Film Series and Montana PBS will present the next in its free screening series with **Jonnie** on Thursday, September 10th. The film begins at 7pm at the Shane Lalani Center for the Arts with a special Q&A to follow.

Jonnie Jonckowski’s obsession with becoming a champion bull rider defied gender stereotypes and resulted in life-threatening injuries. It also led to a life of astonishing triumph and heartbreak.

Jonnie stitches together a woman’s intrepid pursuit of a world title in the 1980s with her dramatic present-day story: rescuing battered horses, battling natural disasters, and fiercely devoting herself to a community in need. With a graceful blend of archival and verité footage, dynamic interviews,

and flashbacks brought to life through artful sketch animation, the feature-length documentary explores the human need to find meaning in whatever we do.

There will be a Q&A with the filmmakers and Jonnie Jonckowski following the screening.

Forum talks proposed local gov changes

The Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at Montana State University will host a Friday Forum on September 11th on proposed **local government changes** that will appear on Montanans’ ballots this November. The event will be held from noon to 1pm online via Zoom and is free and open to the public.

Two government study commissions, comprising volunteers elected by voters in November 2024, spent the past two years considering how Bozeman and Gallatin County governments could better serve their rapidly growing populations.

During the forum, Jeff Krauss from the county study commission and Carson Taylor and Deanna

Campbell from the city study commission will explain the recommended changes that will appear on November ballots and the reasoning behind them. The panel will respond to questions from the audience as time permits.

Participants must register for the forum by 11am Sept. 11th and can do so online at the OLLI at MSU website or via Zoom. Upon registration confirmation, participants will receive an email with the Zoom link and instructions to join the forum.

OLLI at MSU Friday Forums are a program of MSU Academic Technology and Outreach and offer discussions on timely local and regional topics from September to May.

PK premieres new season back-to-back

Still basking in the glow of its 50th celebration this spring, **PechaKucha Night(s)** return to Bozeman with the season premiere this month. The events will be held at Downtown Bozeman’s Ellen Theatre on Wednesday and Thursday, September 9th and 10th. Both shows begin at 6:40pm and feature the same eclectic lineup of local storytellers each night.

How many of you have heard someone play a theremin? Marla Goodman – a lifelong perfectionist, plagued by self-doubt – will tell the story of this most unusual musical instrument and how it helped her conquer anxiety and creative paralysis.

We’re all familiar with Montessori schools but Mary Ellen Maunz will trace the worldwide acceptance of Maria Montessori’s methodologies. And we’ll learn, Maria was nominated three times for the Nobel Peace prize but not because of her lovely little schools.

Those of us with school children know that they can make us do things we never thought we would do. Ephie Risho will tell the tale of this third grade child asking him, “Will you write a book with me?” From there the plot thickened.

There are children and then there are stepchildren. Brooke Poole

will push back upon the negative stereotypes of being a stepmom and reflect upon the moments that have helped her “step” more fully and confidently into that role.

Much more than shelters, we all aspire to make our houses homes. But home interiors vary widely and wildly. Jeri Everly will explore which of the five archetypes best fit your personality and lifestyle.

As polarization increases and constructive discussions wane, Christine Pierce, a world traveler and dialogue practitioner, will share how she has learned to listen to diverse opinions and to find her own voice – even at the dinner table.

With a goal of lifting all local voices, two members of the Bozeman Study Commission, Becky Franks and Jan Strout, will give us a timely update on possibly changes to our City Charter that we’ll be asked to vote upon in November.

If you’re still struggling to communicate with your fellow man, Nicole Bodnar, a horse trainer, will extol the virtues of Equine Facilitated Learning and the healing powers of engaging with these beautiful four-legged friends.

Or, if you just want to get away from it all, Andrew Rashkow will take us on a true Norwegian experience with plenty to Munch on but

he promises not to make you scream.

What if each of us nurtured more life than we destroyed? Nicole Masters, a New Zealand-born agroecologist, will talk about the benefits of regenerative agriculture based upon her ongoing experiences at a Paradise Valley ranch.

Piggybacking on that theme, David Sands, Professor Emeritus at MSU, will examine how crop yields have improved markedly in recent decades but nutritional value has decreased. Efforts to reverse this nutritional decline will be discussed.

Actor and director Cara Wilder, who emceed PK Bozeman’s first PechaKucha Night 15 years ago, will lead the September show.

Heal among Mystics with weekend gathering

Come as you are, and leave knowing more about yourself. The inaugural **Gathering of Mystics** comes to the Gallatin River Hideaway on Bozeman’s edge Friday through Sunday, September 11th–13th.

Enjoy three days of inner-work within a like-minded community, surrounded by others on harmonious paths in a place wild enough to hold whatever comes up. The event will include speakers, workshops, ritual and a full sensory marketplace, led by facilitators and mystics from across Montana. Curated by Event Guardians Lacey Gengenbacher, Ginny Watts, Tamara Leach and Angela Devani. Presentations include:

– *Triggers are Portals to the Gold* with Lacey Gengenbacher (Mountain Witch): A psychotherapist and somatic teacher on turning trauma into medicine, and using triggers as openings back to the parts of you survival once asked you to abandon.

– *The Witch Wound* with Angela Devani (Elemental Magick): On the

ancient fear of being seen, and reclaiming the voice, intuition and gifts that fear has kept exiled.

– *The Body Is the Oracle* with Tamara Leach (Conscious Connected Healing): Three decades of somatic and energy work, plus her own journey through a spinal cord tumor diagnosis, on treating the body as a living guide rather than a broken machine.

During the event’s Embodied workshops, participants can expect movement, not lectures. Across the weekend, facilitators will guide breathwork, ritual, voice, and inner-wisdom practices woven through the property’s many portals – each one designed to alchemize energy into new awareness, not just talk about it. Highlights include somatic breathwork for nervous-system release, an outdoor elemental dance experience, and a ritual offering in a sacred tree circle – plus tarot, sacred rattle-making (very limited seats), vocal alchemy and more.

The event will also feature *The Gathering Marketplace* with mini ses-

sions, Reiki-infused products, crystals, smudges and creative work from local artisans around the Golden Pond. Also find live music, poetry and art for the senses as part of the *Gazebo Portals*.

Big Sky’s combination of wide-open landscapes, local agriculture, outdoor adventure and increasingly sophisticated food scene provides a distinctly Montana backdrop for a celebration of food and drink. And hosted in benefit of the Big Sky Community Food Bank, the event offers something beyond indulgence: a chance to bring people together around the table and give back to the community that makes the setting so special.

Brew-enhanced Follies get last laugh

It’s curtains for the season as the **Brewery Follies** enter their final stretch of performances at Virginia City’s historic H.S. Gilbert Brewery. Catch one last show the weekend of September 4th–6th. Show time is 8pm on Friday and Saturday, with additional weekend matinees at 4pm on Saturday and Sunday.

Performed in a building dating back to 1863, Montana’s first brewery, the long-running summer tradition blends the charm of a preserved Old West setting with the energy of a modern cabaret. Since its founding in 1984, the Follies has become a cornerstone of the town’s entertainment scene, offering visitors a uniquely immersive experience where history and humor collide in an intimate, lively atmosphere.

At its core, the Brewery Follies is a fast-paced musical revue packed with comedy sketches, song parodies, and sharp satire. The performers deliver a constantly evolving show that pokes fun at current events, politics, and everyday life, often through exaggerated characters and clever imperson-

Following its successful inaugural run last season, the 2nd annual **Livingston Bluegrass Festival** comes to Southwest Montana this month. The event will be held Friday and Saturday, September 18th and 19th, at the Henry E. Blake Pavillion outside the Shane Lalani Center for the Arts.

The Festival kicks off on Friday with Montana Standard at 6pm, followed by Damn Tall Buildings.

Montana Standard is a six piece traditional bluegrass band, including national and state fiddle champions, songwriters, exceptional instrumentalists and great singers. Their reverence for the traditions of Bill Monroe, Flatt & Scruggs, Jimmy Martin and the Stanley Brothers, as well as vintage country music sets this band apart.

This seasoned trio has spent over a decade honing their craft through touring worldwide and recording, creating a distinctive sound that weaves heartfelt lyrics into thoughtful fiddle, guitar and bass arrangements. Headliners Special Consensus then take the stage to blow away audiences with their mastery. For five decades, banjo master Greg Cahill has led Special Consensus with a clear musical vision rooted in tradition and driven

by innovation. The band’s sound reflects a deep understanding of bluegrass, blending the drive and harmonies of the classic style with contemporary repertoire and adventurous arrangements. This band has garnered two Grammy nominations and eight IBMA awards.
